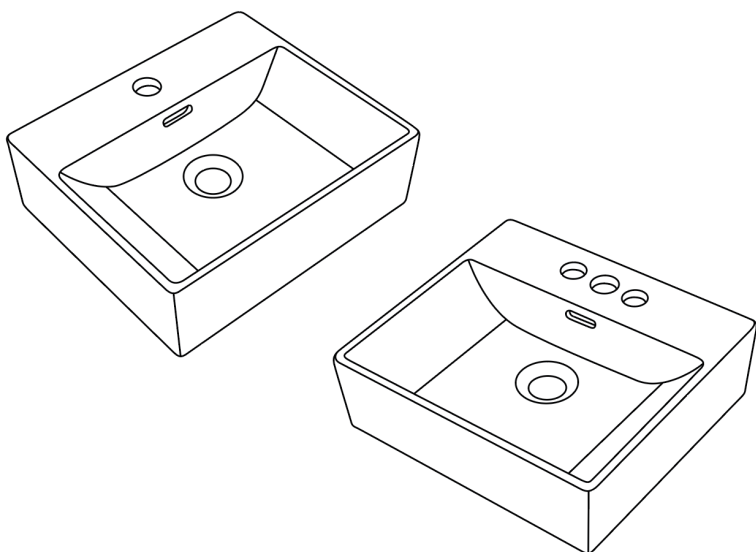

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PRIOR TO INSTALLATION

INSTALLING YOUR WALL-MOUNT SINK.**

Preparation and Safety Tips:

- Check the pipes—if they're old or worn, replace them before installation for optimal performance. You want everything in top shape for your new sink!
- Remember, while your sink is built to last, handle it gently during installation. Lay down protective material to avoid any scratches or damage.
- Safety is key—wear your safety glasses and tool belt before getting started. We're diving into DIY mode, and it's going to be great!

Space and Requirements:

- Make sure your wall-mount sink has ample space to securely mount on the wall, showcasing its modern design. For a secure, leak-proof installation, apply non-water-based silicone around the edges where the sink meets the wall.

Additional Recommendations:

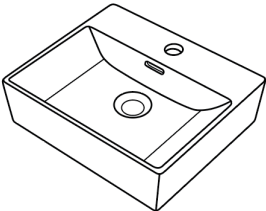

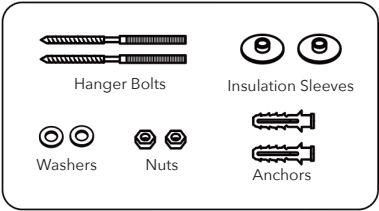

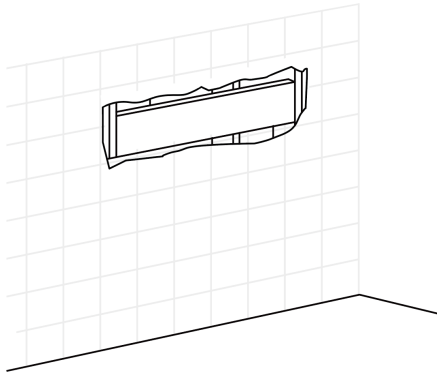

INSTALLATION STEPS

Wall-Hung Installation

Step 1: Wall Preparation

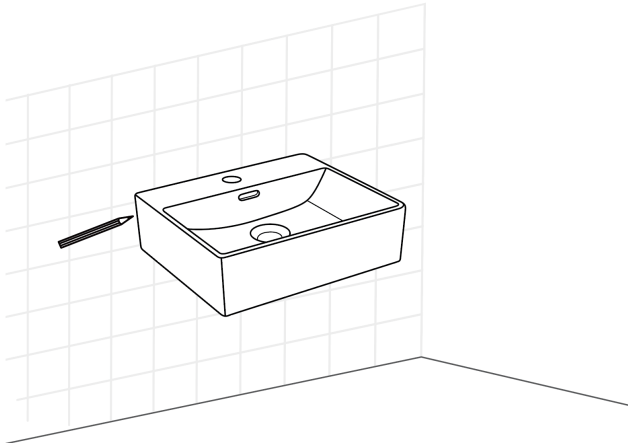
- For bathrooms with stud walls, it's essential to provide adequate wall support for the mounting screws.
- We recommend using 2 x 6 inch plywood to ensure stability and strength for the installation.



Step 2: Determine The Sink Placement

- Set the sink in its intended installation spot, check its level, and then outline where the mounting holes will be.

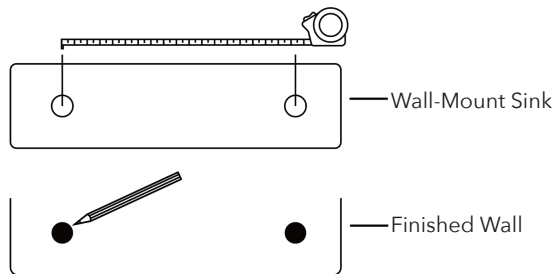
NOTE: The ceramic sink is heavy. Ask someone to help you hold the sink if needed.



Alternative Solution:

If the sink is too heavy for you, this solution may help:

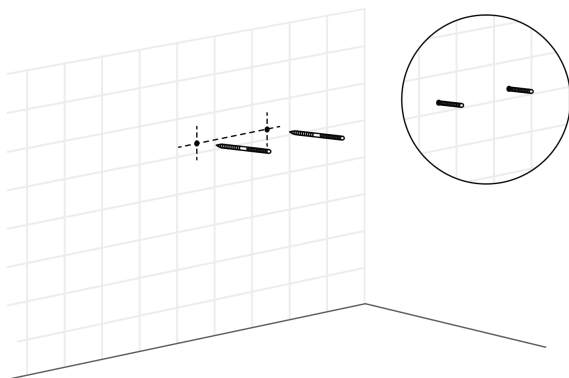
- Measure the distance between the center of each mounting hole on the back of the sink.
- Draw 2 marks on the wall in the desired mounting location. Ensure that the two marks are level with the floor.



Step 3: Drilling

- Drill holes at the marked spots on the wall, and insert the anchors and hanger bolts into these holes.

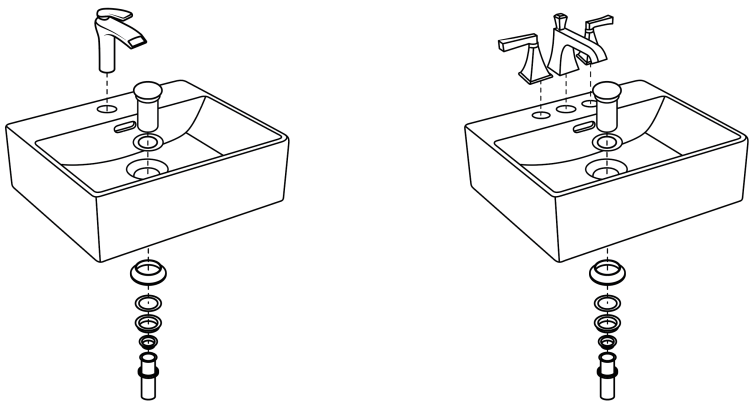
NOTE: Please wear safety glasses to prevent injury.



Step 4: Install The Faucet And The Drain

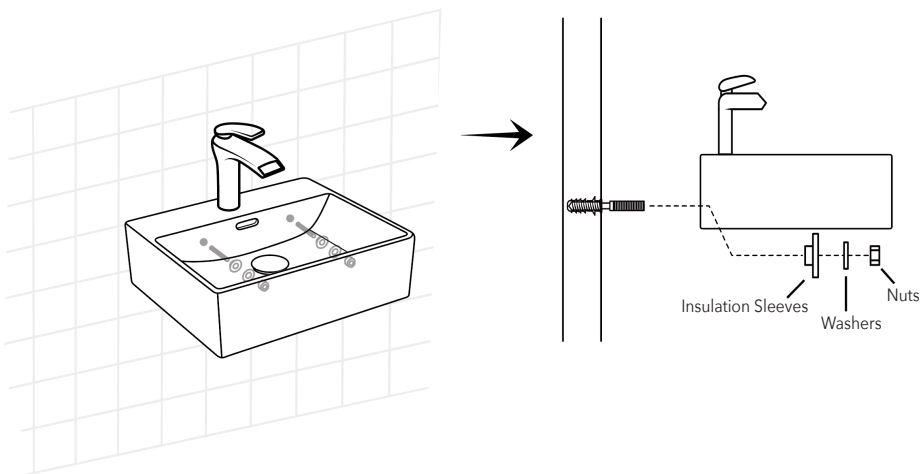
- Install the faucet and drain (both not included) to the sink before mounting it. It will also make later installation steps easier.

NOTE: Both fit 1 3/4" standard drain.

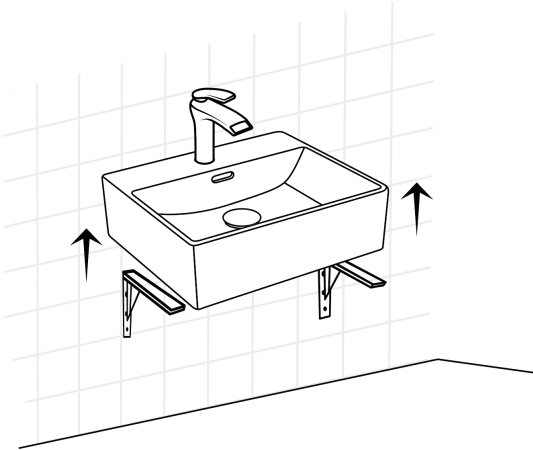


Step 5: Mount The Sink Onto The Hanger Bolts

- Fasten it in place as illustrated. Ensure not to tighten the bolts excessively as this could lead to chipping or cracking of the sink.



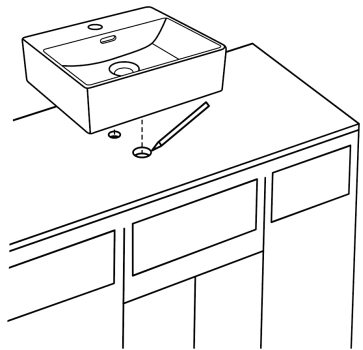
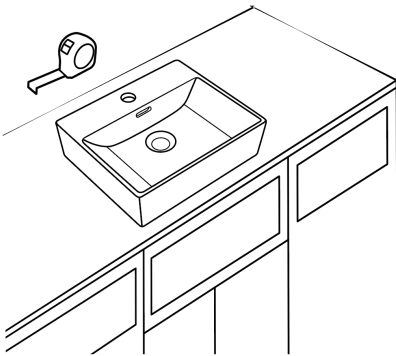
TIP: It is recommended to add brackets (not included) to support the sink due to its heavy weight.



Above Counter Installation

Step 1: Determine The Drain Hole And Faucet Position

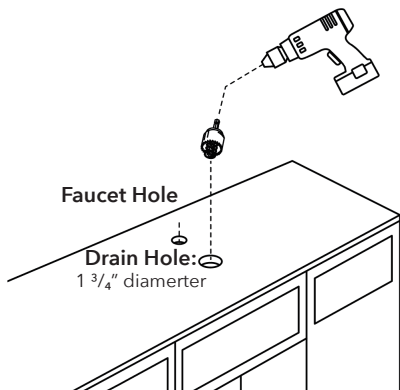
- Dry fit the faucet to the sink and position the sink in the desired location.
- Trace the outline of the drain hole with a pencil and determine the position of the faucet hole.



Step 2: Drill The Countertop

- Cut the countertop for the drain and faucet opening with an appropriate size of hole saw (recommended drain size: 1 $\frac{3}{4}$ ").
- Take off the painter's tape after drilling.

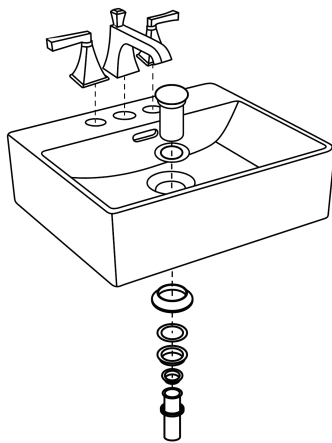
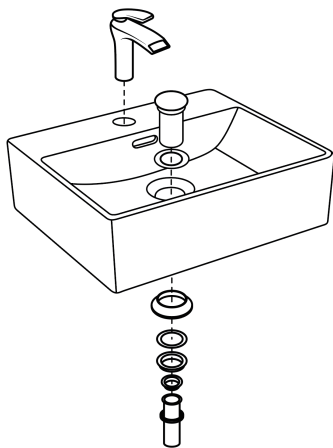
NOTE: Please wear safety glasses to prevent injury.



Step 3: Install The Faucet And The Drain

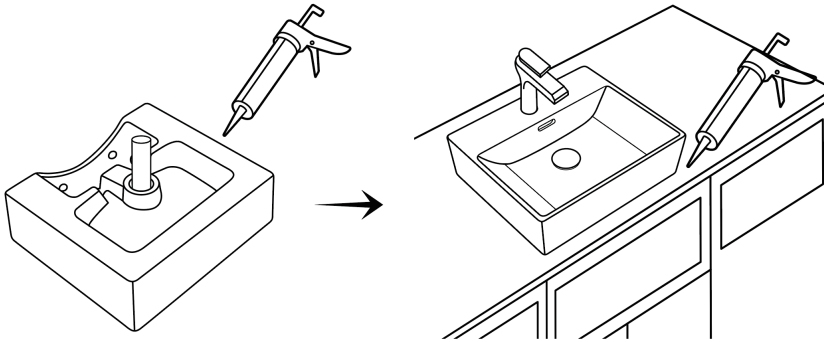
- Install the faucet and drain (both not included) to the sink before mounting it. It will also make later installation steps easier.

NOTE: Both fit 1 $\frac{3}{4}$ " standard drain.



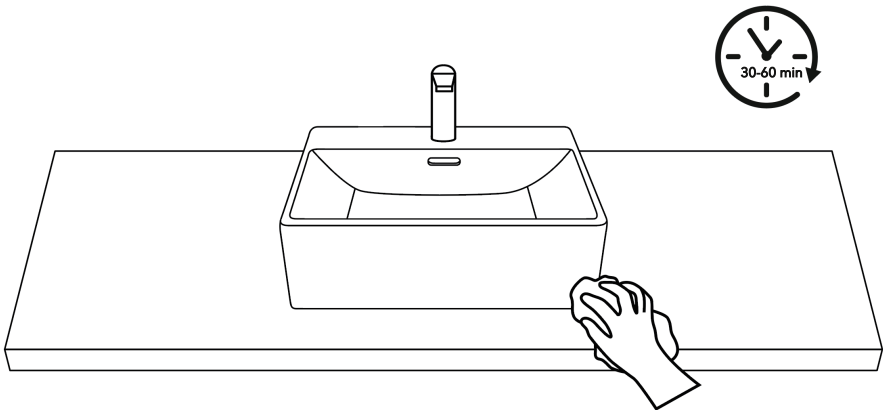
Step 4: Install The Sink

- Apply a bead of clear silicone sealant (or preferred adhesive) around the underside of the sink.
- Turn the sink right-side-up and position it over the drain hole. Carefully place it on the countertop, align, and press it firmly.
- For additional stability, apply a continuous bead of sealant around the perimeter of the sink base.



Step 5: Final Touches

- Allow the sealant to set for 30 – 60 minutes.
- At the same time, remove any excess sealant with a damp cloth or acetone.



PRODUCT CLEANING & CARE

- **Shine:** Bring the glow back to your porcelain bathroom sink simply by pouring vinegar directly into the bowl. Scrub the area with a nylon brush, thoroughly rinse it, and admire the surface's renewed finish, as good as new.
- **Sanitization:** Achieve a deep clean of your porcelain sink with a gentle chlorine-bleach cleaner, adhering strictly to the manufacturer's guidelines. For an alternative method, immerse the sink in a bleach solution (1 part bleach to 3 parts water) for 30 to 60 minutes. Afterward, drain, rinse well, and dry.
- **Scuffing:** To address light scuff marks, which appear as gray lines, apply a mixture of baking soda and water using a sponge or soft cloth. After applying, rinse and dry the area thoroughly. For stubborn stains, consider using a non-abrasive polishing cleanser, making sure to follow the manufacturer's directions.
- **Damage:** Porcelain's durability is one of its greatest attributes, yet it is not impervious to damage from heavy impacts, which can chip the surface. Such chips can make the affected area more prone to staining and bacterial growth. Keep the damaged area clean and dry, and consult a professional plumber for repair options.
- **Clearing And Deodorizing The Overflow Hole:** Use a brush to clean and the boiling water to rinse the sink's overflow hole, stopping clogs and mold. For smells, use baking soda and vinegar, then rinse to keep the sink smelling clean.
- **Cleaning And Maintenance Recommendations:** For routine care, we advise washing enameled surfaces with soap and water after each use, followed by drying with a soft cloth. Though porcelain resists moisture well, it's beneficial to keep it dry as much as possible. Avoid the use of abrasive cleaners or sponges on your porcelain bathroom sink, as these can scratch or mar the finish, detracting from its beauty and longevity.

TROUBLESHOOTING GUIDE

Water Splash:

- Adjusting the water pressure of your faucet can also help reduce splashing. High water pressure can cause harsh streams, leading to splashing.
- Consider using aerated faucets, which introduce air bubbles into the stream, reducing water pressure and providing a lighter and bubbly flow.

Clogged Drain

- First, try using hot or boiling water, or a mixture of vinegar and baking soda, to break up minor blockages. If these methods do not work, consider using a commercial drain cleaner for its stronger cleaning strength.

- If the issue persists, consider using tools like a plunger, a drain auger (also known as a snake), a Zip-It tool, or a wet-dry vacuum.
- Sinks often clog because hair gets caught in the drain. Remove the drain cover, clean out the hair, rinse it off, and put it back.
- If all else fails, clean the P-trap. Place towels and buckets under the sink, locate and unscrew the P-trap, clean it with water, dish soap, or vinegar, reassemble it, and test for proper drainage.

Sink Leakage

- Inspect the seal between the sink and the countertop. Make sure it is intact and has no gaps or visible wear.
- Damaged or old seals may lead to leakage. Clean off the old caulk and apply a new layer of waterproof bathroom caulk or silicone sealant around the base of the sink where it meets the countertop.
- Ensure that the drain assembly is properly tightened. A loose drain can allow water to seep onto the countertop.
- Check the faucet and its connections for leaks. Ensure that the faucet is securely attached and that all connections are tight.
- After making adjustments, dry the area thoroughly and monitor it for a while (use the sink as normal) to see if the issue persists.

Wobbling Or Loose Sink

- If the seal is old and damaged, it may cause the sink to wobble. Remove the old seal with a putty knife, disconnect the drain, and take out the sink. Then clean the remaining seal off the countertop. Apply a fresh layer of silicone sealant between the sink and the countertop to improve stability and seal against water leaks.
- Examine the drain assembly for any looseness. Tighten the drain nut under the sink to secure the drain firmly to the sink.
- Ensure the countertop surface where the sink sits is flat and even. Uneven surfaces can cause the sink to wobble. If the surface is uneven, consider adding shims between the sink and countertop to level the sink.

- AVOID using abrasive cleaners, scouring pads, or steel wool on the sink. These materials can scratch and damage the finish.
- Handle your sink with care, particularly during installation. Wall-mount sinks can suffer chips or cracks from rough handling. Ensure it is properly and securely installed to avoid any risks.
- DO NOT overload the sink with heavy items. Wall-mount sinks are not designed to bear excessive weight, and overloading them could result in damage or a safety hazard.
- DO NOT place hot items directly on the surface of the sink to avoid the risk of cracking or discoloration.
- DO NOT alter the structure of the sink. Any modifications can compromise its integrity and safety.
- Prevent clogs by ensuring the drain remains free of debris. Blocked drains can cause water backup and potential damage.
