



Calla (Zantedeschia) lilies are extraordinary flowers, native to Southern Africa, and are grown from rhizomes. They can be grown in beds, borders, in containers and indoors in a sunny window. Perfect for a cutting garden and beautiful indoors in your nicest vases.

Very popular cut flower, coveted by florists *About This Variety:* The Calla Lily Odessa variety is primarily known for its deep, rich black or dark purple flowers, which are the standout feature of this cultivar. The foliage of Calla Lily Odessa is usually solid green and does not display variegation.

Growing Instructions: It is easy to grow callas. They prefer loose well-drained soil, planted in full sun or partial shade in warmer climates. Plant after threat of frost has passed. The 'eyes' or growing points should be facing upwards when planted. Water liberally during the growing season as they should not be dry at any time.

Care Tip: Calla bulbs are only summer hardy, so be prepared to dig them up in fall or treat them as an annual in areas receiving frost in the winter.

Blooms: Summer Exposure: Full Sun to Partial Shade Height: Grows 24-36" tall Spacing: Plant 18-24" apart, 5" deep USDA Zones: Hardy in USDA zones 8-10
