Caution: You must read these Assembly Instructions before you proceed.




Never adjust chaise lounge or recliner backrest while seated.

Always make sure the backrest is flat before moving the chaise lounge.

Keep all limbs clear from under the backrest when it is in a raised position.

Serious finger, hand, or other bodily injuries may result from adjusting the chaise lounge backrest position while seated.

• Do not put hot items directly on furniture surface.



Do not clean furniture with harsh cleansers or polish.

Stains may be removed with mild soap solution and damp cloth..




Dust and pick-up spills using a clean, non-colored, lint-free cloth.

# Sun Lounger




**CAUTION:** This Sun Lounger is NOT a TOY.


Keep your child / children at bay during the assembly process.




This Sun Lounger has multiple parts and may require up to 60 minutes to assemble. To give you an overview of the Sun Lounger, the above picture is to help you put the various parts into perspective. Please read through the instructions below to familiarise yourself with the parts and steps before assembly.

## Step 1




Unpack and place all parts on a clean, non-marring surface.

# Step 2




Place Right Backrest Frame (I), Middle Backrest frame (J), Left Backrest Frame (H) on a clean, non-marring surface

Then attach Upper Backrest Panel (N), Lower Backrest Panel (M) to Right Backrest Frame (I), Middle Backrest frame (J), Left Backrest Frame (H) using Screw (1) and Allen Wrench (6) as shown above **Do not fully tighten the Screws**.




- 3.1) Position the tenon of Verticle Bar (L) to the housing of Horizion Bar (K) as shown above 3.2) Attach the assembled part in step 3.1 to assembled part in step 2 using Screw (②), Bolt (④) Flat Washer (⑤), and Allen Wrench (⑥) as shown above
- Do not fully tighten the Screws




Position the assembled part in step 3 into Left Seat Base Panel (A) and Right Seat Base Panel (B) using Bolt (4)Flat Washer (5), and Allen Wrench (6) as shown above

#### Do not fully tighten the Bolts




Attach the Seat Base Panel (E) to assembled part in step 4 using Bolt ( $\Im$ ), Flat Washer ( $\Im$ ) and Allen Wrench ( $\Im$ ) as shown above


Do not fully tighten the Bolts



With the help of your adult partner, flip the assembled part in step 5, then attach Second Support Bar (D), Feet Base Panel (F) using Screw (②) and Allen Wrench (⑥) as shown above **Do not fully tighten the Screws** 




With the help of your adult partner, flip the assembled part in step 6, then attach First Support Bar (C), Seat Frame (G) to assembled part in step 6 as shown above



Position the Seat Frame (G) to the assemble in step 7, using Screw (®) with Screwdrive (⑨) as show above picture

**DO NOT** fully tighten the Screws



Place the Cushion (O) onto the Sun Lounger and stick the velcro as shown above.

The Sun Lounger is ready to be used.

This Sun Lounger can only be used on a flat, level surface.

#### **Questions & Answers about Proposition 65**

• What is Proposition 65?

Proposition 65 requires businesses to provide warnings to Californians about significant exposures to chemicals that cause cancer, birth defects or other reproductive harm. These chemicals can be in the products that Californians purchase, in their homes or workplaces, or that are released into the environment. By requiring that this information be provided, Proposition 65 enables Californians to make informed decisions about their exposures to these chemicals.

Proposition 65 also prohibits California businesses from knowingly discharging significant amounts of listed chemicals into sources of drinking water.

Proposition 65 requires California to publish a list of chemicals known to cause cancer, birth defects or other reproductive harm. This list, which must be updated at least once a year, has grown to include approximately 900 chemicals since it was first published in 1987.

• What types of chemicals are on the Proposition 65 list?

The list contains a wide range of naturally occurring and synthetic chemicals that include additives or ingredients in pesticides, common household products, food, drugs, dyes, or solvents. Listed chemicals may also be used in manufacturing and construction, or they may be byproducts of chemical processes, such as motor vehicle exhaust.

• What does a warning mean?

If a warning is placed on a product label or posted or distributed at a workplace, a business, or in rental housing, the business issuing the warning is aware or believes that it is exposing individuals to one or more listed chemicals.

By law, a warning must be given for listed chemicals unless the exposure is low enough to pose no significant risk of cancer or is significantly below levels observed to cause birth defects or other reproductive harm.
