## **AWARNING**

The term "power tool" in the warnings refers to your mains-operated (corded) power tool or battery-operated (cordless) power tool.

#### 1. WORK AREA SAFETY

- A. Keep work area clean and well lit. Cluttered or dark areas invite accidents.
- B. Do not operate power tools in explosive atmospheres, such as in the presence of flammable liquids, gases or dust. Power tools create sparks which may ignite the dust or fumes.
- C. Keep children and bystanders away while operating a power tool. Distractions can cause you to lose control.

#### 2. ELECTRICAL SAFETY

- A. A battery-operated tool with integral batteries or a separate battery pack must be recharged only with the specified charger for the battery. A charger that may be suitable for one type of battery may create a risk of fire when used with another battery.
- **B.** Avoid body contact with earthed or grounded surfaces such as pipes, radiators, ranges and refrigerators. There is an increased risk of electric shock if your body is earthed or grounded.
- C. Do not expose power tools to rain or wet conditions. Water entering a power tool will increase the risk of electric shock.
- **D.** Use a battery-operated tool only with specified battery pack. Use of any other batteries may create a risk of fire.
- E. If operating a power tool in a damp location is unavoidable, use a residual current device (RCD) protected supply. Use of an RCD reduces the risk of electric shock.

#### 3. PERSONAL SAFETY

- A. Stay alert, watch what you are doing and use common sense when operating a power tool. Do not use a power tool while you are tired or under the influence of drugs, alcohol or medication. A moment of inattention while operating power tools may result in serious personal injury.
- **B.** Use personal protective equipment. Always wear eye protection. Protective equipment such as dust mask, non-skid safety shoes, hard hat, or hearing protection used for appropriate conditions will reduce personal injuries.
- C. Prevent unintentional starting. Ensure the switch is in the off-position before connecting to power source and/or battery pack, picking up or carrying the tool. Carrying power tools with your finger on the switch or energising power tools that have the switch on invites accidents.
- **D. Remove any adjusting key or wrench before turning the power tool on.** A wrench or a key left attached to a rotating part of the power tool may result in personal injury.
- **E. Do not overreach. Keep proper footing and balance at all times.** This enables better control of the power tool in unexpected situations.

- F. Dress properly. Do not wear loose clothing or jewelry. Keep your hair, clothing and gloves away from moving parts. Loose clothes, jewelry, or long hair can be caught in moving parts.
- G. If devices are provided for the connection of dust extraction and collection facilities, ensure these are connected and properly used. Use of these devices can reduce dust-related hazards.

#### 4. POWER TOOL USE AND CARE

- **A.** Do not force the power tool. Use the correct power tool for your application. The correct power tool will do the job better and safer at the rate for which it was designed.
- **B. Do not use the power tool if the switch does not turn it on and off.** Any power tool that cannot be controlled with the switch is dangerous and must be repaired.
- C. Disconnect the battery pack from the power tool before making any adjustments, changing accessories, or storing power tools. Such preventive safety measures reduce the risk of starting the power tool accidentally.
- D. Store idle power tools out of the reach of children and do not allow persons unfamiliar with the power tool or these instructions to operate the power tool. Power tools are dangerous in the hands of untrained users.
- E. Maintain power tools. Check for misalignment or binding of moving parts, breakage of parts and any other condition that may affect the power tools operation. If damaged, have the power tool repaired before use. Many accidents are caused by poorly maintained power tools.
- **F. Keep cutting tools sharp and clean.** Properly maintained cutting tools with sharp cutting edges are less likely to bind and are easier to control.
- G. Use the power tool, accessories and tool bits etc., in accordance with these instructions, taking into account the working conditions and the work to be performed. Use of the power tool for operations different from those intended could result in a hazardous situation.

#### 5. BATTERY TOOL USE AND CARE

- **A. Ensure the switch is in the off position before inserting battery pack.** Inserting the battery pack into power tools that have the switch on invites accidents.
- **B. Recharge only with the charger specified by the manufacturer.** A charger that is suitable for one type of battery pack may create a risk of fire when used with another battery pack.
- **C.** Use power tools only with specifically designated battery packs. Use of any other battery packs may create a risk of injury and fire.
- D. When battery pack is not in use, keep it away from other metal objects, like paper clips, coins, keys, nails, screws, or other small metal objects that can make a connection from one terminal to another. Shorting the battery terminals together may cause burns or a fire.

#### 6. SERVICE

A. Have your power tool serviced by a qualified repair person using only identical replacement parts. This will ensure that the safety of the power tool is maintained.

#### POLE HEDGE TRIMMER SAFETY WARNINGS

- Keep all parts of the body away from the cutter blade. Do not remove cut material or hold material to be cut when blades are moving. Make sure the switch is off when clearing jammed material. Blades coast after turn off. A moment of in-attention while operating the hedge trimmer may result in serious personal injury.
- Carry the hedge trimmer by the handle with the cutter blade stopped. Proper handling of the hedge trimmer will reduce possible personal injury from the cutting blades.
- When transporting or storing the hedge trimmer always fit the cutting device cover.
- Hold the power tool by insulated gripping surfaces only, because the cutting blade may contact hidden wiring or its own cord. Cutting blades contacting a "live" wire may make exposed metal parts of the power tool "live" and could give the operator an electric shock.
- Use both hands when operating the hedge trimmer. Using one hand could cause loss
  of control and result in serious personal injury.
- Before starting the hedge trimmer, make sure the blade is not in contact with any object.
- Stop the unit, remove the battery pack, and make sure the blade has stopped before setting the unit down.
- Always stop the motor when cutting is delayed or when walking from one cutting location to another.
- Keep unit clean of grass clippings and other materials. They may become lodged in the cutting blades.
- Store the unit inside in a dry place, either locked up or up high to prevent unauthorized use or damage. Keep out of the reach of children or untrained individuals.
- DANGER Keep hands away from blade. Contact with blade will result in serious personal injury.
- · Replace blade cover when unit is not in use.
- Never douse or squirt the unit with water or any other liquid. Keep handles dry, clean, and free from debris. Clean after each use; see storage instructions.
- · Secure the unit while transporting.
- Battery operated units do not have to be plugged into an electrical outlet; therefore, they are always in operating condition. Be aware of possible hazards even when unit is not operating.

- Always use two hands when operating the extended-reach hedge trimmer. Hold the
  extended-reach hedge trimmer with both hands to avoid loss of control.
- Always use head protection when operating the extended-reach hedge trimmer overhead. Falling debris can result in serious personal injury.

#### FOR ALL APPLIANCES



### **KNOW YOUR POLE HEDGE TRIMMER** (See Figure 1.)

The safe use of this product requires an understanding of the information on the product and in this operator's manual as well as a knowledge of the project you are attempting. Before use of this product, familiarize yourself with all operating features and safety rules.

#### **SAFETY LOCK BUTTON & TRIGGER**

The safety lock button must be pulled back before the trigger is depressed. Once the trigger is engaged, the safety lock button can be released. When the trigger is released, the safety lock button will automatically return to the locking position.

#### SEVEN-POSITION PIVOTING HEAD

The hedger head can be adjusted by pulling back on the pivot button.

#### **BLADE**

Dual action steel blades for cutting hedges and shrubs.

#### **BATTERY RELEASE BUTTON**

Press to release the battery pack from the tool.

## **ASSEMBLY**

#### **UNPACKING**

This product requires assembly.

- Carefully remove the product and any accessories from the box. Make sure that all items listed in the package contents section are included.


## **ASSEMBLY**

#### **CONNECTING THE POLES (FIG.2)**

- 1. Set the unit on a flat, level surface.
- 2. Loosen the knob (1) on the coupler (2).
- 3. Push in the release button (3) located on the left pole (4). Align the release button with the positioning hole (5) with the direction of the arrow (6) and slide the two poles together. Rotate the lower pole until the button locks into the positioning hole.




## **AWARNING**

Periodically check the connections to ensure that they are tightened securely.


### ATTACHING MACHINE TO SHOULDER STRAP (FIG.3)

• Attach the carabiner (1) to the carrying ring (2) on the drive tube.




### **SHOULDER STRAP (FIG.4)**

- 1. Put on the shoulder strap (1).
- 2. Adjust the length of the strap so that the carabiner (2) is about a hand's width below your right hip.



### **DETACHING MACHINE FROM SHOULDER STRAP (FIG.5)**


• Press down the bar on the carabiner (1) and pull the carrying ring (2) out of the carabiner.



### ADJUSTING THE TRIMMER HEAD ANGLE (FIG.6)

The trimmer head pivots 135° and can be locked into 7 positions within that range.

- Pull back on the pivot button.
- While pulling the pivot button, move the head forward or backward.
- Release the pivot button once the trimmer head is in the desired position.
- The trimmer head should lock securely in place.


#### **APPLICATIONS**

You may use this product for the purpose listed below:

· Trimming and shaping hedges and shrubbery.

### **INSERTING AND REMOVING THE BATTERY (FIG.7)**

- To insert the battery (1), line it up with the battery compartment (3) on the tool. Slide the battery into the battery compartment and push until the battery snaps into place.
- To remove the battery, push the release button (2). This will cause the battery to raise out of the tool.
- Pull the battery out of the battery compartment.



## **OPERATION**

## **WARNING**

Let the tool work at its own pace. Do not overload.

### **TURNING THE TOOL ON AND OFF (FIG.8)**

For your safety, this tool is equipped with a double switching system. This system prevents starting the tool inadvertently.

#### **SWITCHING ON**


- Pull the safety lock button (1) backward using your thumb and at the same time squeeze the trigger (2).
- · Release the safety lock button (1).

#### **SWITCHING OFF**

· Release the trigger (2).

### **AWARNING**

Never attempt to lock the trigger in the on position.




#### OPERATING THE POLE HEDGE TRIMMER


#### TIPS FOR OPTIMUM USE

- Start by trimming the top of the hedge. Slightly tilt the tool (up to 15° relative to the line of cut) so that the blade tips point slightly towards the hedge (FIG.9). This will cause the blades to cut more effectively. Hold the tool at the desired angle and move it steadily along the line of cut. The doublesided blade allows you to cut in either direction.
- In order to obtain a very straight cut, stretch a piece of string along the length of the hedge at the desired height. Use the string as a guideline, cutting just above it.
- In order to obtain flat sides, cut upwards with the growth. Younger stems move outwards when the blade cuts downwards, causing shallow patches in the hedge. (FIG.10)
- Take care to avoid any foreign objects. Especially avoid hard objects such as metal wire and railings, as these could damage the blades.

## **OPERATION**

• Regularly oil the blades.





## **WARNING**

Keep hands away from blade. Contact with blade will result in serious personal injury.

## **MAINTENANCE**

### **CLEANING, MAINTENANCE AND STORAGE**

Your tool has been designed to operate over a long period of time with a minimum of maintenance. Continuous satisfactory operation depends upon proper tool care and regular cleaning. Your charger does not require any maintenance apart from regular cleaning.

## A WARNING

Before performing any maintenance on the tool, remove the battery from the tool. Unplug the charger before cleaning it.

### After use and before storage

- After use, carefully clean the blades. After cleaning, apply a film of light machine oil to prevent the blades from rushing.
- Regularly clean the ventilation slots in your tool using a soft brush or dry cloth.
- Regularly clean the motor housing using a damp cloth. Do not use any abrasive or solvent based cleaner.
- Make sure all switches are free of debris before and after use.

#### **STORAGE**

- · Fully charge the battery.
- · Remove the battery from the tool.
- Store the tool and battery in a secure and dry location. The storage temperature must always remain in the range of 50°F to 104°F. Place the battery on a level surface. Before using the tool after prolonged storage, fully charge the battery again.

## **ENVIRONMENTALLY SAFE BATTERY DISPOSAL**

The following toxic and corrosive materials are in the batteries used in this string trimmer battery pack: **Lithium-Ion**, a toxic material.





## **AWARNING**

All toxic materials must be disposed of in a specified manner to prevent contamination of the environment. Before disposing of damaged or worn out Lithium-Ion battery packs, contact your local waste disposal agency, or the local Environmental Protection Agency for information and specific instructions. 
