Subject: Information Regarding PFAS, Our Commitment to Safety and Proposition 65 (California Safe Drinking Water and Toxic Enforcement Act of 1986) – Customer Notification

Dear Valued Customer,

We are reaching out to provide you with information regarding **per- and polyfluoroalkyl substances (PFAS)** and **Proposition 65 (California Safe Drinking Water and Toxic Enforcement Act of 1986)** and to keep you informed about the steps we are taking to ensure the safety, quality, and compliance of our products.

PFAS are a broad group of synthetic chemicals that have been used for decades in many industrial and consumer applications due to their resistance to heat, water, and oils. In recent years, regulatory agencies have increased attention to PFAS because certain compounds may persist in the environment and accumulate over time.

Additionally, Proposition 65 requires businesses to provide “clear and reasonable” warnings before exposing individuals in California to chemicals that the State has determined may cause cancer, birth defects, or other reproductive harm.

Our Commitment

At Advanced Building Products, the safety of our customers and the integrity of our products are our highest priorities. We aim to align with evolving regulations and best practices.

What This Means for You

At this time, our products do not contain intentionally added PFAS. Our suppliers have confirmed that:

- a) To the best of our suppliers’ knowledge, our polypropylene does not contain chemicals listed on California’s Safe Drinking Water and Toxic Enforcement Act of 1986 (Proposition 65)**
- b) Our polypropylene suppliers do not sell or produce any products with any intentionally added PFAS**



- c) Our fabric may contain trace Antimony Trioxide (as a resin catalyst). Antimony Trioxide is a chemical on the Proposition 65 list however, within the fabric from this supplier; Antimony Trioxide tests at the 'less than 350 ppm' (parts per million) level; meeting end test requirements codified at 21 CFR Part 177.1630
- d) Our fabric may contain ethylene glycol (polyethylene PET fabric). However, the levels of unreacted ethylene glycol found in PET resins comply with limits set forth in EU regulation number 10/2011. These levels also meet extraction limits as specified in 21 CFR Part 177.1630 and represent a "no significant risk" level adopted by California's Health and Welfare Agency.
- e) Our color additives suppliers identify that colors used in our products do not contain any carcinogens or reproductive toxins presently known by the State of California to cause cancer or reproductive toxicity at a level of exposure subject to the requirements of Prop 65.

We will provide additional updates should any of this information change. Trust is important to us, and we remain committed to transparency.
