

## ZEVNI VANITY LIGHTING DIMENSIONS GUIDE

### I. OVERVIEW

To choose the right size of a vanity light, we recommend the width of your vanity light should be about 3/4 of the mirror's width or several inches shorter than the vanity.

Hang lights in multiples, change up your style with sconces or mount lights upward for ambient lighting.

### II. VANITY LIGHT SIZES GUIDE

Vanity Width	Recommended Mirror Width (slightly smaller)	Recommended Light Width
24 inches	20–22 inches	14–20 inches
30 inches	24–28 inches	17–25 inches
36 inches	28–32 inches	20–29 inches
42 inches	34–38 inches	24–34 inches
48 inches	40–44 inches	28–40 inches
60 inches (Single Mirror)	54–58 inches	38–52 inches
60 inches (Double Mirrors)	2 × 24–26 inches	Each: 17–23 inches
72 inches (Single Mirror)	66–70 inches	46–63 inches
72 inches (Double Mirrors)	2 × 28–32 inches	Each: 20–29 inches

**Notes:**

- Mirror width usually leaves 1–2" space on each side of the vanity
- Choose closer to 70% if the space is tight or you prefer a lighter look
- Choose closer to 90% for a more filled-in, balanced look above the mirror
- For dual mirrors, apply the 70–90% rule to each mirror individually

**III. TIPS****1. Measure Your Space**

Start by measuring the width of your mirror, if you have one, or the width of the vanity itself. Knowing this will help you decide the ideal size of the vanity light. Also, consider the height of your vanity and the overall space available in your bathroom.

**2. Determine Light Width**

Ideally, your vanity light should be at least 75% the width of your mirror and not extend over its edges. So, if your mirror is 30 inches wide, your vanity light should be around 22-28 inches wide. However, if you don't have a mirror and are centering the light over the vanity, choose a fixture that is around one-third the width of the vanity.

**3. Think About the Number of Lights**

If you have a wider vanity or mirror, consider a vanity light with multiple bulbs. A three-light fixture is a standard size, but you might choose one with more lights for larger vanities

**4. Keep Proportions in Mind**

The size of your vanity light should match the proportions of your bathroom. For instance, a large vanity light might overwhelm a small bathroom, while a small light might look out of place in a large bathroom.

**5. Consider the Bulb Size**

The size of the bulbs your fixture will use is also crucial. Bigger bulbs might provide more lighting but consider whether they will look proportionate to your vanity and mirror.


**6. Beyond Size**

While size is important, it's not the only thing to consider when choosing a vanity light. You should also think about the style, finish, and type of light the fixture will provide, as well as how it will fit into your overall bathroom decor.

## IV. INSTALLATION REFERENCE

### Case 1: Living Room Wall Light Sizing Guide

This diagram shows the recommended wall light size in relation to the frame width above a sofa or in a living room setting.



- **Frame < 30":**


Light should be half the frame width (e.g. 14.5" light for 29" frame)

- **Frame 30-60":**

Light should be two-thirds the frame width (e.g. 22" light for 33" frame)

### Case 2: Bathroom Vanity Light Sizing Guide

This diagram provides correct mounting heights and light-to-mirror ratio for bathroom vanity lighting.



- **Above mirror:**

Light width = 75% of mirror width  
(e.g. 20" light for 26.6" mirror)

- **Side sconces:**

Mount the sconces 60–65" from the floor, 4" from mirror edge
