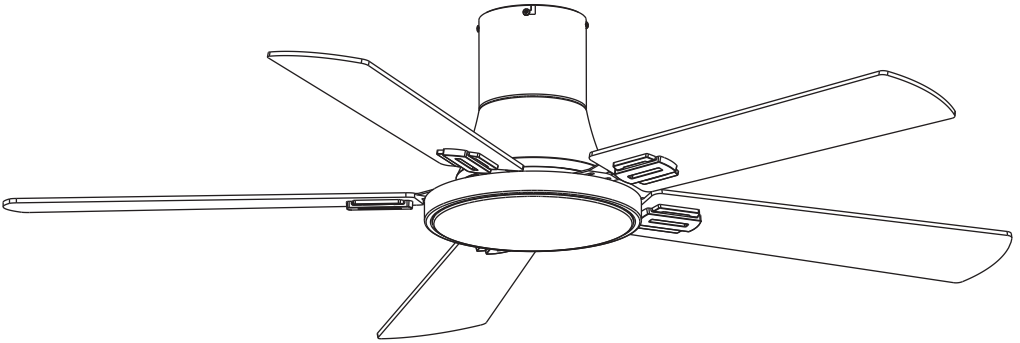


Ceiling Fan

Installation Instructions



SAFETY PRECAUTIONS

1.  The fan can only operate properly with all blades installed. If the fan is started without blades, it will beep and automatically shut off.
2.  If you are unfamiliar with electrical installations, please consult or hire a qualified electrician.
3.  Before operating any electrical connections of the fan, be sure to disconnect the main power by removing the fuse or turning off the circuit breaker.
4.  Do not use the fan with a dimmer switch or a speed controller together, as it may damage the fan. It should only be operated using its own built-in speed settings.
5.  The mounting point for the fan must be capable of supporting at least 77 pounds (35kg). If installing on a ceiling outlet box, use the mounting screws provided. Most outlet boxes typically used for installing lighting fixtures cannot be used for installing fans and may need to be replaced. If in doubt, please consult a licensed electrician.
6. Ensure the fan's electrical connections are properly grounded to prevent any electrical hazards.
7. When deciding where to mount the fan, please ensure that there is at least 30 inches (76 cm) of space between the fan and any walls or other obstacles that its blades might hit. The greater this distance, the more effective the airflow generated will be. After installing, please ensure that the blades are at least 7.5 feet (2.3 meters) above the ground.
8. When complete, check that all screws and fasteners are tightened to avoid noise from loose parts.
9. Before changing the direction of rotation, ensure that the fan has completely come to a stop to avoid further damaging the motor.
10. Fan fasteners can loosen over time. Inspect the key components of the fan, such as the connections of blades, screws, and bracket, at least once a year to ensure everything remains secure.
11. If the fan experiences abnormal rotation or vibration, please stop using it and contact the manufacturer or a professional.
12. Turn off the fan before cleaning. Please use dry cloth or slightly wet one instead of using water or cleaning agent.

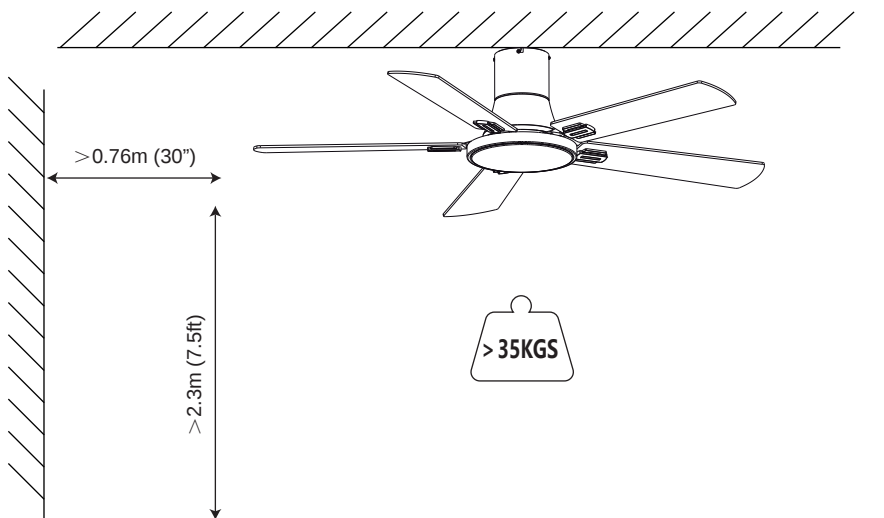
- Reorient or relocate the receiving antenna.

Battery Safety Tips:

DIMENSIONS

- First, check the room size, and then ensure there is at least 30 inches (76 centimeters) of clearance or space between the fan and any walls or other obstacles that the fan blades might hit to optimize airflow. After installation, please verify blades are at least 7.5 feet (2.3 meters) above the ground.



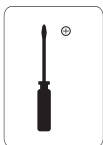

CHOOSING THE RIGHT LOCATION

- If installing on a ceiling outlet box, check its suitability first. Most outlet boxes intended for lighting are not suitable for fans and may need replacing. Consult a licensed electrician if unsure.

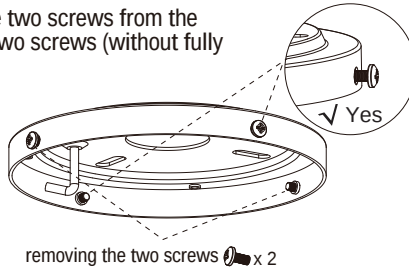


HANGING BRACKET INSTALLATION

- Before starting any work, make sure that the power to the main power cabinet is safely turned off. This can be done by either removing the fuse or switching off the circuit breaker.
- Make sure that ceiling joists are strong enough and of adequate size to support the weight of the fan of about 35 kg.
- Use different screws to fix the bracket according to the ceiling material.



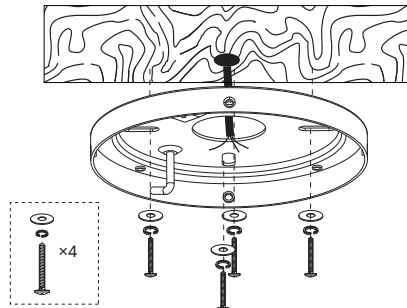
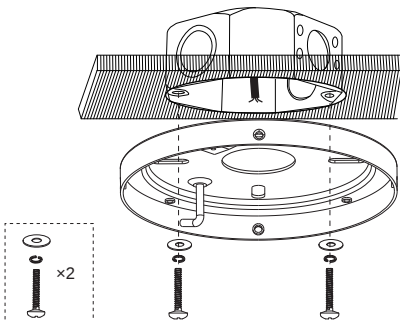
- ① As shown on the right, remove two screws from the bracket and loosen the other two screws (without fully removing them).



- ② Use different screws to fix the bracket according to the ceiling material.

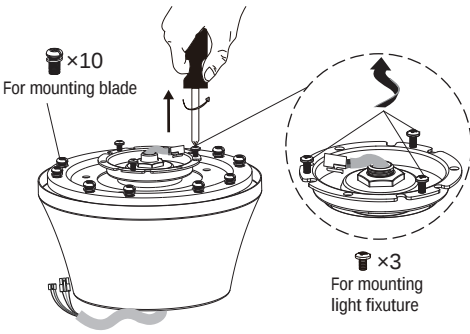
Solid Wall Ceiling



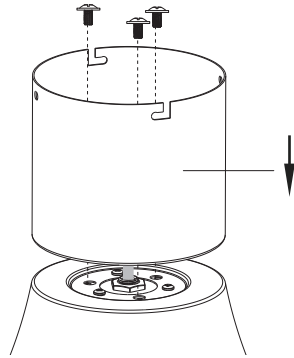
Check whether bracket is securely installed or not.

ASSEMBLE THE FAN

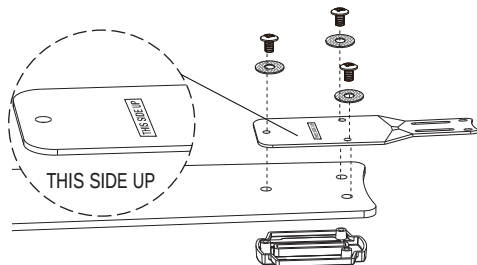
- ① Remove the pre-installed screws from the motor assembly.



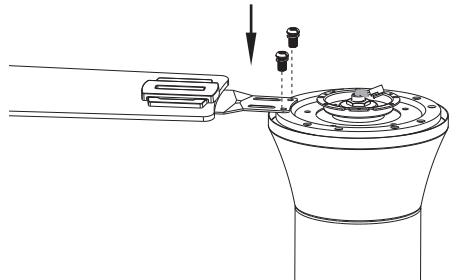
- ② Installing the canopy.



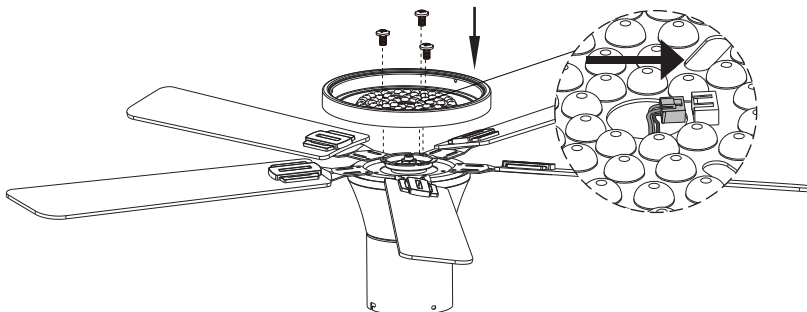
- ③ Attach a blade to the blade bracket by aligning the holes on the blade support plate with the holes on blades and blade arms, inserting the screws into the holes in the blade support plate and through the blade and blade arm.



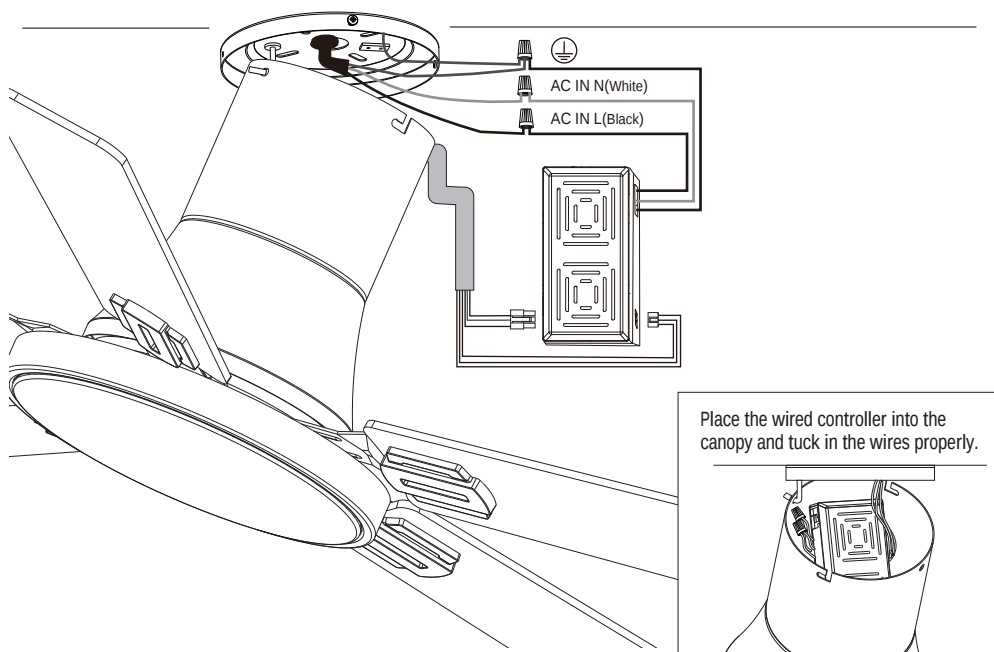
- ④ Align the holes on the blade with the corresponding ones on the motor assembly. Then, use the blade screws to secure the blades in place and tighten them. Repeat this step until all blades are installed.



- ⑤ Align the holes on the light fixture with the corresponding holes on the motor assembly, then connect the wiring terminals. Use the 3 screws you removed to install the light fixture onto the motor assembly.

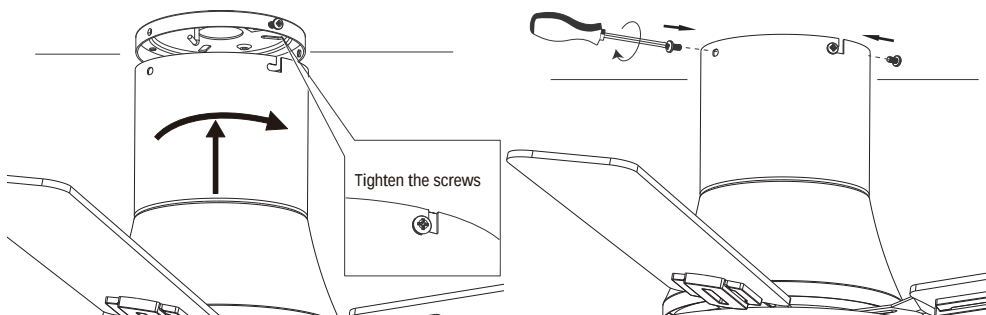


WIRING DIAGRAMS

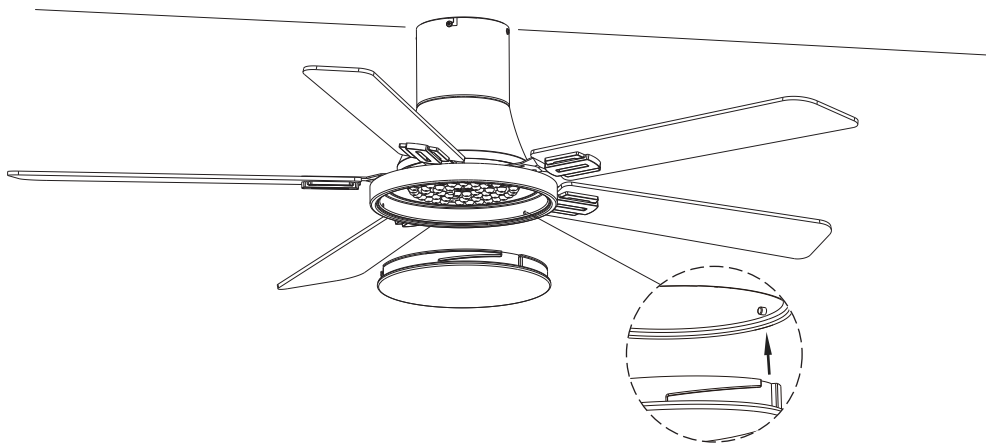


MOUNTING REMAINING PARTS

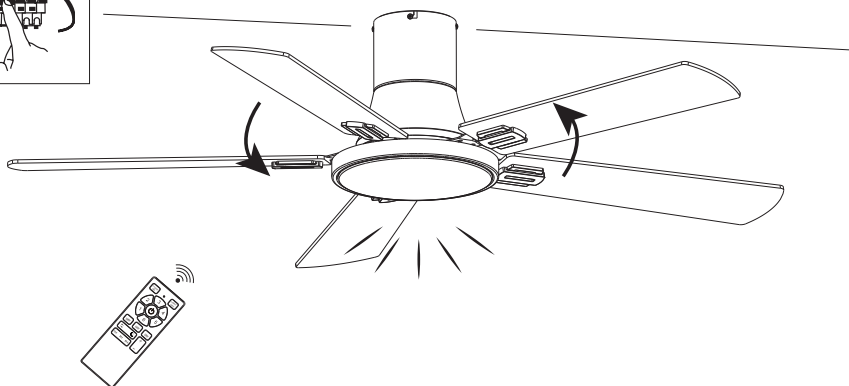
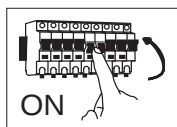
- ① 1. Remove the fan from the hook of the bracket, lift and rotate the fan so that the L-shaped slot sits on the two screws to the bracket, and finally tighten the two.
2. Fasten the rest two screws and tightened them.



- ② Align the slot on the lampshade with the clip on the light. Rotate the lampshade until it is securely fixed in place.

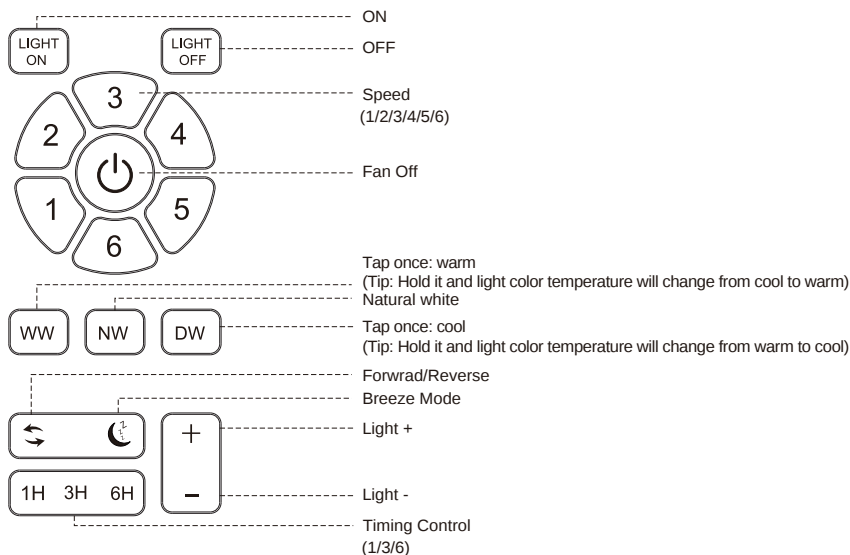

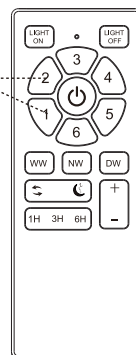
Remote Control Pairing

- NOTE: Your remote control has been factory pre-set, so no pairing is required for first-time use. Re-pairing is only necessary if the remote control malfunctions.

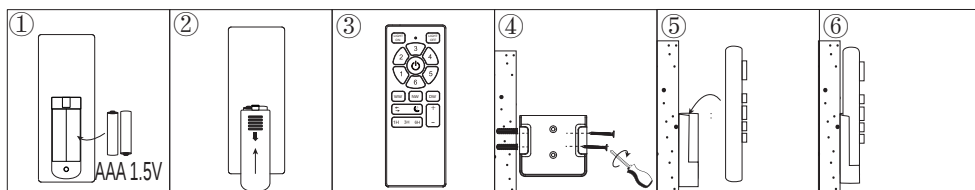
Press and hold
for about 3 sec



1. Install 2 batteries into the remote controller.
2. Turn on the power. Within 10 seconds of powering on the fan, press and hold the "1" and "2" buttons for about 3 seconds. After a beeping sound, pairing is complete, and the fan is ready for use.

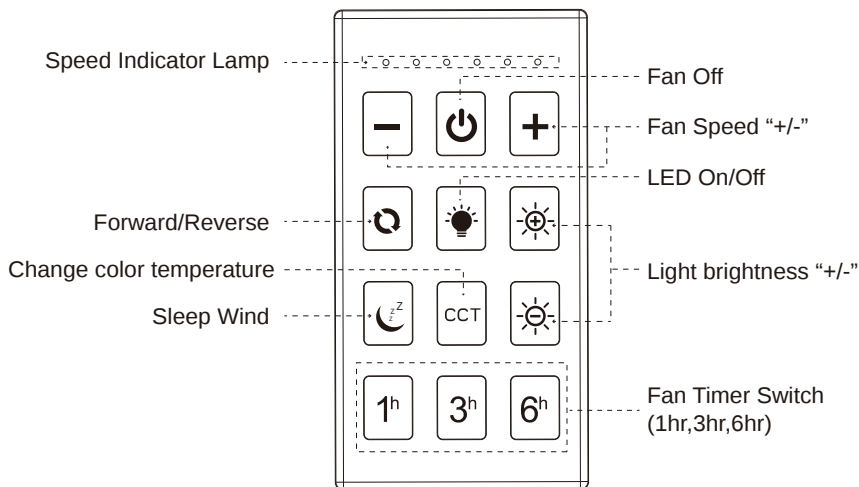


Installing Wall-Mounted Remote Control Holder

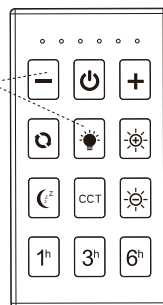


Remote Control Pairing

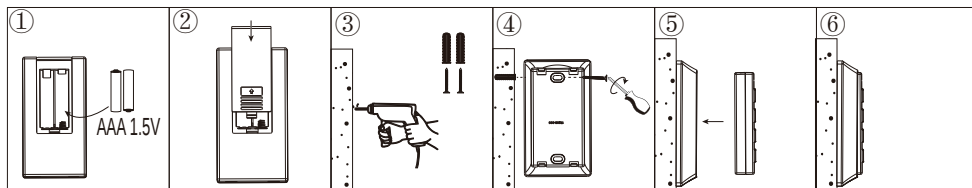
- Note: Your remote control has been factory pre-set, so no pairing is required for first-time use. Re-pairing is only necessary if the remote control malfunctions.

Press and hold
for about 3 sec

1. Insert the 2 pcs of batteries into transmitter.
2. Turn on the power supply to the fan. Within 5 sec, press and hold the "—" and "💡" button for about 3 sec. Once the receiver has detected the frequency, receiver will "Beep Beep" twice. Programming process is completed and fan is ready to use.

TROUBLESHOOTING



WARNING: Before attempting any repairs, ensure that the power cabinet is turned off

Problem	Troubleshooting
The fan will not start.	☐ Check the main and branch fuses or circuit breakers.
	☐ Check the wire connections to the fan.
	☐ Make sure the remote control has been paired.
The fan sounds noisy.	☐ Make sure all motor housings are secured and tightened.
	☐ Make sure the screws that attach the fan blade to the motor hub are tight.
	☐ Check for any friction between the fan blades and the motor housing.
	☐ Allow a 24-hour "break-in" period. Most noises related to the new fan will disappear during this time.
	☐ Check if there is any friction between the light or the base cover and the blades.
	☐ Ensure the distance between the canopy and ceiling is minimal, and it should not touch the ceiling.
	☐ Check if the outlet box is securely installed and if rubber washers are used between the bracket and the outlet box.
The fan is rotating, but the airflow is insufficient.	☐ The fan may be operating in reverse, causing air to flow upwards.
	☐ The fan may be too small compared with the size of the room.
	☐ Obstacles in the room may be blocking airflow.

Remote Control Fault Alert Tones Explanation			
No.	Buzzer Alert Tone	Problems	Troubleshooting
1	Two short, quick sounds, repeated 6 times with a 1-second interval between each repetition.	motor phase failure	1. Check whether the motor terminal and the controller are properly connected or if the connection is loose. 2. Check if any of the three wires in the motor terminal are loose. If neither of the above issues is present, the controller needs to be replaced. If replacing the controller does not solve the problem, the fan motor itself needs to be replaced.
	A continuous alert sound, ringing 5 times in each instance.		
2	Three short, quick sounds, repeated 4 times with a 1-second interval between each repetition.	Motor stall	1. When the motor engine stops, move the blade to rotate it so as to predict the motor is tight or jammed. If the blades rotate and the motor continues to rotate with inertia without any abnormal noise after releasing them, it indicates that the motor and structural components are properly installed. In this case, the controller needs may need to be replaced. 2. If the fan blades are too tight, try manually rotating them for 5 revolutions. Then restart the fan, setting the speed to the maximum. If it operates normally after this, keep the fan running at maximum speed for 10 minutes. If any issues persist, the controller needs to be replaced. 3. If the blades cannot be moved at all, check whether any incorrect screws or deformed structural parts are causing the fixed components to jam with the rotating parts. If not, the fan motor needs to be replaced.
	A continuous alert sound, ringing 6 times in each instance.		

Addressing Fan Wobbling Issues During Operation

If the fan body wobbles during Operation, this is not an indication of a fault (even if it wobbles a few centimeters). To reduce it, you can turn off the fan and then:

1. Check if all the blades are properly secured by tightening the screws.
2. Check the distance between each blade and the ceiling. Measure the distance to the ceiling as shown in the image. If there is a change and you have already tightened the screws, ensure that all blades are the same shape. If any blade appears noticeably different, it could cause wobbling during operation. If you've completed these steps and the wobbling still persists, use the provided balancing kit for dynamic balancing, as follows.

(1) Turn the fan on to its highest speed to maximize the wobble.

(2) Turn off the fan. Select one blade and place a clip on it (see image 2), clipping it to the edge of the blade.

(3) Turn the fan on and set it to the highest speed, checking whether the wobble improves or worsens. If there is no improvement, move the clip to another blade. Repeat this process to determine which blade can reduce the wobble.

(4) Once the blade is determined, leave the clip on it and adjust the clip forward or backward on this blade until the best position is found that provides the most effective result.

(5) Finally, remove the clip and place one of the balance weights on the upper centerline of the blade where the clip was located.
