The term perennial is reserved for plants that live for more than two years. Horticulturists then further classify them into woody and herbaceous perennials. Woody perennials are whose above ground parts persist over winter, while herbaceous perennials are non-woody plants that die back to the ground each winter. However, the roots survive the winter and the plants re-sprout in the spring. This collection is the herbaceous type, which make them high value plants that will return for years to come with little to no effort.

Growing Instructions: They are not fussy, but choose your location wisely so that they can be left alone once planted.


Care Tip: The plants require little maintenance as long as they are planted properly and establish themselves.
