Please read and understand this entire manual before attempting to assemble, operate or install the product.

This manual contains important information about the assembly, operation and maintenance of this patio heater. General safety information is presented in these first few pages and is also located throughout the manual. Keep this manual for future reference and to educate new users of this product. This manual should be read in conjunction with the labeling on the product. Safety precautions are essential when any mechanical or propane-fueled equipment is involved. These precautions are necessary when using, storing and servicing this item. Using this equipment with the respect and caution demanded will reduce the possibilities of personal injury or property damage. The following symbols shown below are used extensively throughout this manual. Always heed these precautions, as they are essential when using any mechanical or fueled equipment.

A DANGER

DANGER indicates an imminently hazardous situation which, if not avoided will result in death or serious injury.

A CAUTION

CAUTION indicates an imminently hazardous situation which, if not avoided, may result in minor or moderate personal injury, or property damage.

A WARNING

WARNING indicates an imminently hazardous situation which, if not avoided will result in death or serious injury.

If you smell gas:

- 1. Shut off gas to the appliance.
- 2. Extinguish any open flame.

Do not store or use gasoline or other flammable vapors and liquids in the vicinity of this or any other appliance. An LP-cylinder not connected for use shall not be stored in the vicinity of this or any other appliance.

Certain materials or items, when stored under the heater, will be subjected to radiant heat and could be seriously damaged.

A DANGER

Failure to comply with the precautions and instructions provided with this heater can result in death, serious bodily injury and property loss or damage from hazards of fire, explosion, burn, asphyxiation and/or carbon monoxide poisoning. Only persons who can understand and follow the instructions should use or service this heater.

A DANGER

- EXPLOSION FIRE HAZARD
- Keep solid combustibles, such as building materials, paper or cardboard, a safe distance away from the heater as recommended by the instructions.
- Provide adequate clearances around air openings into the combustion chamber.
- Never use the heater in spaces which do or may contain volatile or airborne combustibles, or products such as gasoline, solvents, paint thinner, dust particles or unknown chemicals.
- During operation, this product can be a source of ignition. Keep heater area clear and free from combustible materials, gasoline, paint thinner, cleaning solvents and other flammable vapors and liquids. Do not use heater in areas with high dust content. Minimum heater clearances from combustible materials: 3 feet from the sides & 3 feet from the top.

A WARNING

BURN HAZARD

- Never leave heater unattended when hot or in use.
- Keep out of reach of children.

- Never store propane near high heat, open flames, direct sunlight, other ignition sources or where temperatures exceed 120 degrees F (49°C).
- Propane vapors are heavier than air and can accumulate in low places. If you smell gas, leave the area immediately.
- Never install or remove the propane cylinder
- This heater is red hot during use and can ignite flammables that are too close to the burner. Keep flammables at least 3 feet from sides & 3 feet from top. Keep gasoline and other flammable liquids and vapors well away from heater.
- Store the propane cylinder outdoors in a well-ventilated space out of reach of children. Never store the propane cylinder in an enclosed area (house, garage etc.). If heater is to be stored indoors, disconnect the propane cylinder for outdoor storage.

We cannot foresee every use which may be made of our heaters.

PREPARATION

Before beginning assembly of product, make sure all parts are present. Compare parts with package contents list and hardware contents above. If any part is missing or damaged, do not attempt to assemble the product. Contact customer service for replacement parts.

Please ensure all transit protection (foam, cardboard, bubble wrap, etc.) is removed. Carefully put the ruby quartz glass tube aside after removing the bubble wrap and foam material.

Estimated Assembly Time: 45 minutes

Tools Required for Assembly (not included):

Phillips screwdriver w/medium blade. Leak Detection Solution.

ASSEMBLY INSTRUCTIONS

1. Install wheel kit to base plate by inserting (2) x Bolt M8 x 24mm through the wheel kit and base plate and securing them with (2) x Nut M8 (use supplied wrench to tighten).



2. REFLECTOR ASSEMBLY:

Place reflector over prefixed studs as shown (fig. 2) and hand tighten 1 M8 nut (HH) per prefixed stud.



3. GUARD REMOVAL:

Remove one protective steel guard by unscrewing 4pcs M5x10mm as show in fig 3.





ASSEMBLY INSTRUCTIONS

- 5. Install The Glass Tube. (Part E)
 - a. Please the black silicone ring (Part RR) on the end of the glass tube as illustrated.
 - b. Carefully insert the top of the glass tube through the bottom of the emitter. The three spring backets on the inside of the emitter will stabilize the outside of the glass tube.
 - c. Finally, place the bottom end of the glass tube with the silicone ring to sit into the opening at the base of the unit, as shown in Fig. 5. Ensure that the black silicone ring at the lower end of the glass tube is completely installed and secured in the circular channel at the base opening.





6. Tighten the nuts M8 x3 (HH) on the reflector. These were hand tightened from step 2.


Use bolt M8 (FF) to attach reflector cover (AA) on top of the reflector as shown in fig 6.






7. These 8 metal brackets are included with the hardware and must be installed into the back panel using the M6x12mm screws. Be sure to screw into the unit from the outside of the panel. The screwhead should be exposed on the outer surface of the panels.








8. Align bottom panel on top of base plate and connect them together by securely installing (5) M8×15 mm screws through the designated 90 degree metal brackets with a philips screwdriver.






9. Align top portion on top of bottom panel and connect them together by securely installing (5) M8x15 mm screws through the designated 90 degree metal brackets with a philips screwdriver.








10. Re-install the protective steel guard(D) by hanging it on the upper support slots. Next tightly secure it with all (12) of the M5×10 mm screws into their original support slots accordingly.


11. Wrap gas intake with teflon tape (TT) in clockwise direction (fig. 11-A). Then connect gas hose (H) (fig. 11-B)


The knob on the propane tank must be closed. Make sure that the knob is turned clockwise to a full stop. The cylinder supply system must be arranged for vapor withdrawal. Check that the control knob on the control unit is turned off. Hold old the regulator in one hand and insert the nipple into the valve outlet. Be sure the nipple is centered in the valve outlet. The coupling nut connects to the large outside threads on the valve outlet. Hand-tighten the coupling nut clockwise until it comes to a full stop. Firmly tighten by hand only. (fig. 11-C)


To Disconnect: Fully close the tank by turning ∩ clockwise until the regulator assembly detaches clockwise. Turn the coupling nut ∩ counterclockwise.

A WARNING

After the cylinder is placed inside the heater, secure the cylinder with block belt tightly.







A WARNING

Ensure the hose does not contact any high temperature surfaces, or it may melt and leak causing a fire. After the cylinder is placed inside the heater, secure the cylinder with block belt tightly.



12. Leak testing: See leak testing diagram for areas to check. Turn all burner controls to the off position. Turn gas supply valve on.


Brush a half-and-half solution of liquid soap and water onto all joints and connections of the regulator, hose, manifolds and valves.

Bubbles will indicate a gas leak. Either tighten the loose joint or have the part replaced with one recommended by the Customer Care department and have the patio heater inspected by a certified gas installer.

Never use an open flame to check for gas leaks.

A leak test must be performed annually and each time a cylinder is hooked up or if a part of the gas system is replaced, and whenever any gas components are being replaced or serviced.






If the leak cannot be stopped, immediately shut off the gas supply, disconnect it, and have the patio heater inspected by a certified gas installer or dealer. Do not use the patio heater until the leak has been corrected.

OPERATION INSTRUCTIONS

Caution: Do not attempt to operate until you have read and understand all General Safety Information in this manual and all assembly is complete and leak checks have been performed.

Before Turning Gas Supply ON:

- 1. Your heater was designed and approved for outdoor use only. Do NOT use it inside a building, garage, or any other enclosed area.
- 2. Make sure surrounding areas are free of combustible materials, gasoline, and other flammable vapors or liquids.
- 3. Ensure that there is no obstruction to air ventilation. Be sure all gas connections are tight and there are no leaks.
- 4. Be sure the cylinder cover is clear of debris. Be sure any component removed during assembly or servicing is replaced and fastened prior to starting.

Before Lighting:

- 1. Heater should be thoroughly inspected before each use, and by a qualified service person at least annually. If relighting a hot heater, always wait at least 5 minutes.
- 2. Inspect the hose assembly for evidence of excessive abrasion, cuts, or wear. Suspected areas should be leak tested. If the hose leaks, it must be replaced prior to operation. Only use the replacement hose assembly specified by manufacturer.

Lighting:

Note: This heater is equipped with a pilot light that allows for safer startups and shutdowns. Pilot must be lit before main burner can be started.

WARNING:

- 1. The whole gas system, hose, regulator, pilot or burner should be inspected for leak before use.
- 2. Check the hose assembly for sign of extreme abrasion, cuts or wears. Leak test suspected areas. If there is evidence of excessive abrasion or wear, or if the hose is damaged or leaks, it must be replaced with an Australian certified hose and regulator assembly.
- 3. Avoid twisting the flexible tubes and hoses.
- 4. Make sure the ventilation opening of the cylinder enclosure, control compartment, burner and circulation air passageways of the heater are free and clear of debris. If debris, spider or insect nests are found, clean the holes with heavy-duty pipe cleaner or compressed air.
- 5. Always keep a dry chemical fire extinguisher readily available.
- 6. For safety, always allow a 5-minute complete shut off period before re-lighting a hot heater.
- 7. Avoid repeated ignition attempts if ignition doesn't start except for first time or new gas bottle starts.

DIRECT OPERATION ON THE CONTROL UNIT

TO TURN ON THE HEATER


- 1. Turn on the valve of the gas supply cylinder.
- 2. Press and hold the POWER button on the unit or the remote control for 2-5 seconds. The digital display will appear showing setting "1" and the ignition will begin to "click" repeatedly to ignite the pilot. Shortly after, the unit pilot will ignite the Burner flame in the glass tube at Setting 1.
- 3. Press the UP and DOWN button to switch to the temperature heat setting. Every time the UP and DOWN button is pressed it will switch from 1(LOW) 2 3 4 5(HI).

OPERATION INSTRUCTIONS

The 2 seconds delay ignition is not a flaw. It has been intentionally designed to prevent accidental ignition. Holding the POWER button for 2 seconds releases the safety lock and starts the ignition.

TO TURN OFF THE HEATER

- 1. Press POWER button again to enter into close status
- 2. Turn off the valve of the gas cylinder and disconnect the



IMPORTANT


- When the appliance is operating, the control unit can automatically detect any breakdown in 1 second and automatically cuts off both power and gas supplies.
- Gas supply will automatically cut off in 25 seconds ± 5 seconds if pilot flame goes out accidentally.
- If unit does not turn on and "E2" appears on the digital panel, this means that the unit is not receiving propane gas. Please make sure your tank is securely connected to the unit, fully opened and there is no blockages.
- If the error persists, please contact our customer service team.
 When ignition batteries are exhausted pilot and burner flame will extinguish automatically and gas supply will be cut off.


M WARNING

- 1. Close the valve of the gas cylinder or the regulator after use.
- 2. Do not move the heater, or cover it with protective cover after it has been turned off until the temperature has cooled down.

Caution: Avoid inhaling fumes emitted from the heater's first use. Smoke and odor from the burning of oils used in manufacturing will appear. Both smoke and odor will dissipate after approximately 30 minutes. The heater should NOT produce thick black smoke.

NOTE: In normal condition, the height of the flame in the high position reaches the top emitter. The height of the flame in the low position reaches about 1/3 of that of the tube. Please adjust the flame size according to actual needs. The flame is stable and bright. Contrarily it is abnormal condition.





CARE AND MAINTENANCE

Re-lighting:

- 1. Press POWER button again to enter into close status.
- 2. Wait at least 5 minutes, to let gas dissipate, before attempting to relight POWER. Flash out will happen if performed before 5 minutes are up.
- 3. Repeat the "Lighting" steps on prior page.

M WARNING

- 1. Change the gas cylinder in a amply ventilated area, away from any ignition source (candle, cigarettes, other flame producing appliances, ...)
- 2. Make sure that all taps on the consuming appliance are in closed position.

REPLACING THE GAS CYLINDER

- 1. Close the valve of the gas cylinder.
- Disconnect the regulator from the cylinder following the instructions that came with your regulator.
- 3. Replace the cylinder.
- 4. In the absence of any flame, remove the plug or seal cap from the cylinder valve.
- 5. Check for the presence and good state of the gasket before connecting the regulator.
- 6. Check that the regulator seal is correctly fitted and able to fulfil its function.
- 7. Perform leak test using soapy water solution.

A WARNING

FOR YOUR SAFETY:

- Do NOT touch or move heater for at least 45 minutes after use.
- Reflector is hot to the touch.
- Allow reflector to cool before touching.

WARNING

FOR YOUR SAFETY

Heater will be hot after use. Handle with extreme care.

Note: After use, some discoloration of the emitter screen is normal.

Operation Checklist

For a safe and pleasurable heating experience, perform this check before each use.

Before Operating:

- 1. I am familiar with entire owner's manual and understand all precautions noted.
- 2. All components are properly assembled, intact and operable.
- 3. No alterations have been made.
- 4. All gas connections are secure and do not leak.
- 5. Wind velocity is below 10 mph.
- 6. Unit will operate at reduced efficiency below 40°F.
- 7. Heater is outdoors (outside any enclosure).
- 8. There is adequate fresh air ventilation.

CARE AND MAINTENANCE

- 9. Heater is away from gasoline or other flammable liquids or vapors.
- 10. Heater is away from windows, air intake openings, sprinklers and other water sources.
- 11. Heater is at least 2.3 feet on top and at least 3.3 feet on sides from combustible materials.
- 12. Heater is on a hard and level surface.
- 13. There are no signs of spider or insect nests.
- 14. All burner passages are clear.
- 15. All air circulation passages are clear.
- 16. Children and adults should be alerted to the hazards of high surface temperatures and should stay away to avoid burns or clothing ignition.
- 17. Children should be carefully supervised when they are in the area of the heater.
- 18. Clothing or other protective material should not be hung from the heater, or placed on or near the heater.
- 19. Any guard or other protective device removed for servicing the heater must be replaced prior to operating the heater.
- 20. Installation and repair should be done by a qualified service person. The heater should be inspected before use and at least annually by a qualified service person.
- 21. More frequent cleaning may be required as necessary. It is imperative that control compartment, burner and circulating air passageways of the heater be kept clean.

After Operation

- 1. Gas control is in OFF position.
- 2. Gas tank valve is OFF.
- 3. Disconnect gas line.

CARE AND MAINTENANCE

WARNING

FOR YOUR SAFETY:

- Do NOT touch or move heater for at least 45 minutes after use.
- Reflector is hot to the touch.
- · Allow reflector to cool before touching.

To enjoy years of outstanding performance from your heater, make sure you perform the following maintenance activities on a regular basis:

Keep exterior surfaces clean.

- 1. Use warm soapy water for cleaning. Never use flammable or corrosive cleaning agents.
- 2. While cleaning your unit, be sure to keep the area around the burner assembly dry at all times. Do not submerge the control valve assembly. If the gas control is submerged in water, do NOT use it. It must be replaced.
- a. Keep the appliance area clear and free from combustible materials, gasoline and other flammable vapors and liquids.
- b. Do not obstruct the flow of combustion and ventilation air.
- c. Keep the ventilation opening(s) of the cylinder enclosure free and clear from debris.
- 3. Air flow must be unobstructed. Keep controls, burner, and circulating air passageways clean.

CARE AND MAINTENANCE

Visually checking portions of the hose assembly located within the confines of the heater post. Inspect the entire hose assembly at least annually, disassembling the reflector and burner. Inspect the hose assembly for evidence of excessive abrasion, cuts, or wear. Suspected areas should be leak tested.

- Gas odor with extreme yellow tipping of flame.
- Heater does NOT reach the desired temperature.
- Heater glow is excessively uneven.
- Heater makes popping noises.
- Spiders and insects can nest in burner or orifices. This dangerous condition can damage heater and render it unsafe for use. Clean burner holes by using a heavy-duty pipe cleaner. Compressed air may help clear away smaller particles.
- Carbon deposits may create a fire hazard. Clean dome and burner screen with warm soapy water if any carbon deposits develop.

Note: In a salt-air environment (such as near an ocean), corrosion occurs more quickly than normal. Frequently check for corroded areas and repair them promptly.

TIP:

Use high-quality automobile wax to help maintain the appearance of your heater. Apply to exterior surfaces from the pole down. Do not apply to emitter screen or domes.

Storage

Between uses:

- Press POWER button again to enter into close status
- Disconnect PROPANE cylinder.
- Store heater upright in an area sheltered from direct contact with inclement weather (such as rain, sleet, hail, snow, dust and debris).
- If desired, cover heater to protect exterior surfaces and to help prevent build-up in air passages. Note: Wait until heater is cool before covering.
- Do Not expose the heater under the rain or snow.

During periods of extended inactivity or when transporting:

- Press POWER button again to enter into close status
- Disconnect PROPANE source and move to a secure, well ventilated location outdoors.
- Store heater upright in an area sheltered from direct contact with inclement weather (such as rain, sleet, hail, snow, dust and debris).
- If desired, cover heater to protect exterior surfaces and to help prevent build-up in air passages.
 Never leave PROPANE cylinder exposed to direct sunlight or excessive heat.
 Note: Wait until heater is cool before covering.

Service

Only a qualified service person should repair gas passages and associated components.

Caution: Always allow heater to cool before attempting service.
