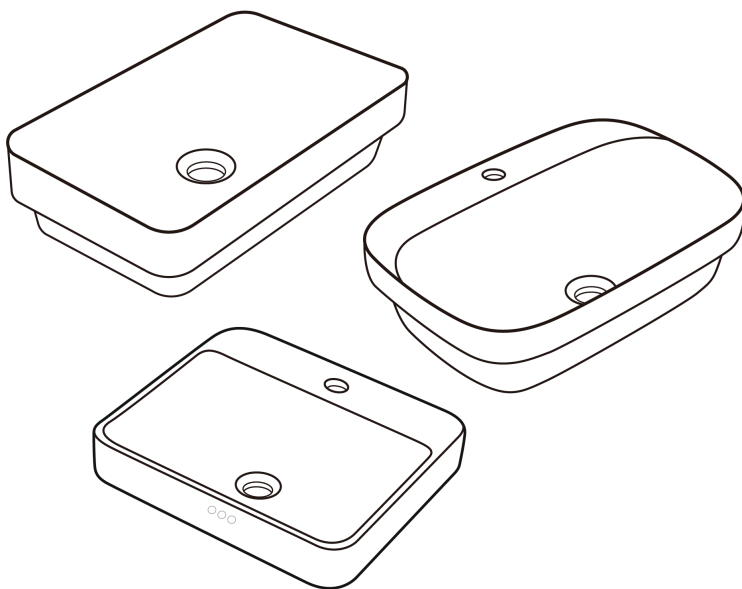

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PRIOR TO INSTALLATION

Preparation and Safety Steps:

- Check the condition of your pipes—if they appear worn or damaged, consider replacing them. We want everything in top shape for this stunning sink!
- Keep in mind that while your sink is robust, it's still delicate. Handle it with care and place protective material underneath to keep it safe. A little extra support is always a good idea!
- And safety first! Equip yourself with a tool belt and safety glasses as you embark on this DIY adventure!

Space and Sealing Guidelines:

- Make sure your semi-recessed sink has enough space to showcase its design, especially around the faucet and backsplash. To ensure a leak-proof installation, use non-water-based silicone for sealing.

Additional Success Tips:

- When it's time for cleaning, avoid harsh chemicals and opt for something gentler. Our sinks are durable but still deserve a bit of care!

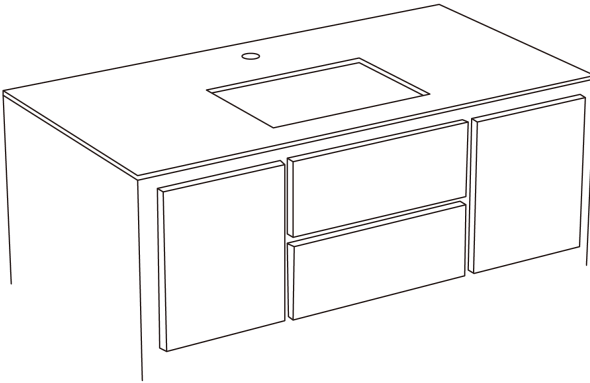

SINK INSTALLATION

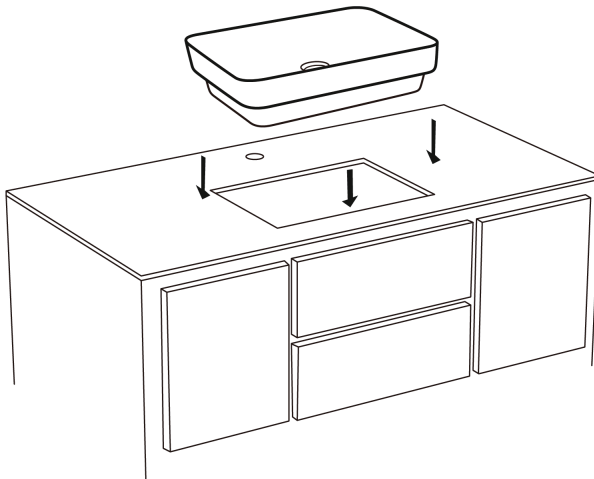
Step 1: Prepare the Countertop for Installation

- Prepare the countertop with the necessary openings for the sink and faucet.



Step 2: Position the Sink

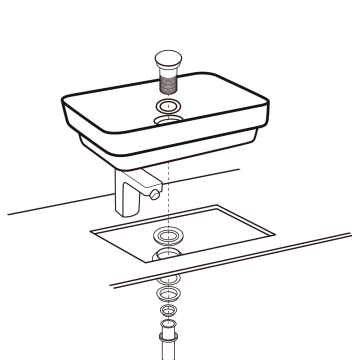
- Temporarily place the sink in the desired mounting position to check for cutout alignment.



Step 3: Install the Faucet and Drain

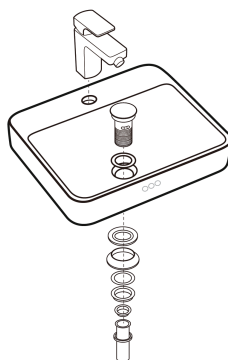
- Before mounting the sink, install the faucet (not included) and the drain to the sink. This will simplify the later installation steps. **For detailed drain installation guide, please refer to PAGE 7.**

NOTE: The included drain type (shown as A or B below) depends on whether the sink has an overflow hole.

For sinks without overflow hole



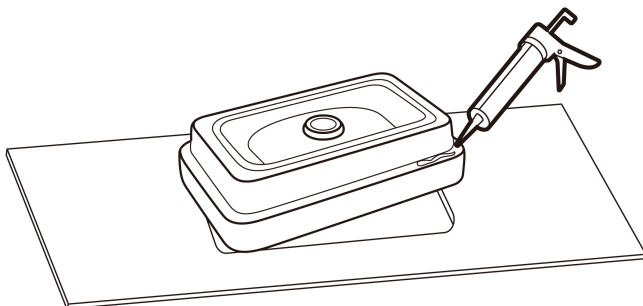
(B)

Step 4: Apply Sealant

- Apply a suitable amount of plumber's putty or silicone sealant around the underside rim of the sink.

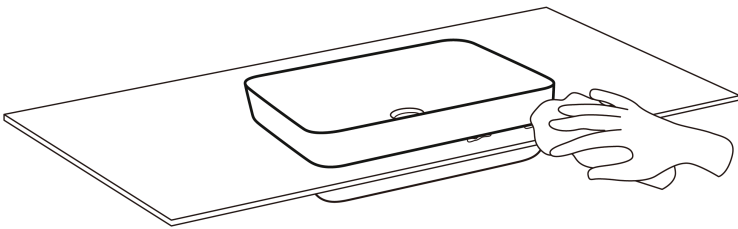
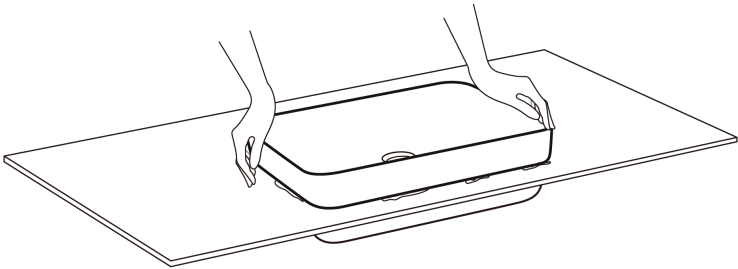
NOTE: Due to the exposed edges, using sealant is crucial to prevent moisture from penetrating underneath and causing damage or mold.



Step 5: Install the Sink

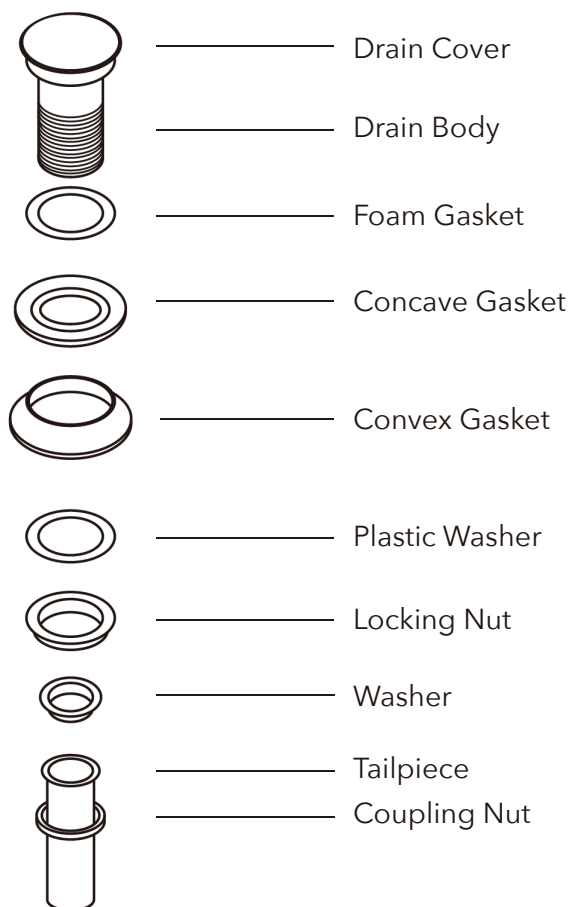
- Carefully lower the sink into the cutout, ensuring proper alignment, and press down firmly to secure it to the countertop.
- Confirm that the sink is flush with the countertop to prevent any rocking or tilting.
- Allow the sealant to set for 30 to 60 minutes.

NOTE: Immediately wipe away any excess sealant with a cloth dampened with water or mineral spirits.



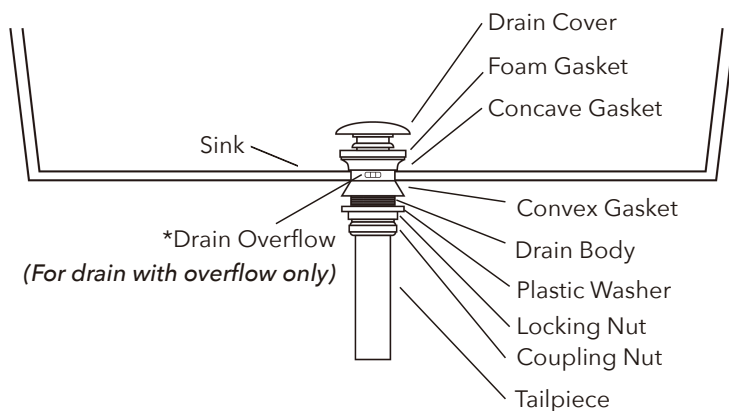
DRAIN INSTALLATION GUIDE

☐ Take out the drain from the box and disassemble it.



- Place the components into the drain opening as illustrated. Ensure proper alignment of the drain body with the sink. Use plumber's putty to enhance stability if needed.
- From the underside of the sink, apply plumber's tape to the threading on the drain body.
- Slide in the components as illustrated. Use an adjustable wrench to tighten if needed.
- Place the washer inside the tailpiece. Thread the tailpiece onto the drain body until tight.

NOTE: For drains with an overflow, align the drain body's overflow hole with the sink's overflow hole.



CARE AND MAINTENANCE

- **Restoring Shine:** Restore the luster of your ceramic sink by pouring vinegar directly into the bowl. Scrub gently with a nylon brush, rinse thoroughly, and enjoy the renewed finish.
- **Deep Cleaning:** For thorough sanitization, use a gentle chlorine bleach cleaner. Alternatively, soak the sink in a bleach solution (1 part bleach to 3 parts water) for 30 to 60 minutes. Rinse well and dry afterward. When using bleach, be sure to follow the manufacturer's instructions and take appropriate safety precautions.
- **Addressing Scuff Marks:** To remove light scuff marks, which may appear as gray lines, apply a mixture of baking soda and water with a sponge or soft cloth. Rinse and dry the area thoroughly. For tougher stains, consider a non-abrasive polishing cleanser.
- **Managing Damage:** Although ceramic is durable, it can chip from heavy impacts, leading to increased staining and bacterial growth. Keep any damaged areas clean and dry, and consult a professional for repair options.
- **Overflow Hole Maintenance (if applicable):** Regularly clean the overflow hole to prevent clogs and bacterial growth, especially in semi-recessed designs where water flow may be more concentrated. Use a brush to clean the overflow hole, rinsing with boiling water. For odors, a mixture of baking soda and vinegar can help, followed by rinsing to keep the sink smelling fresh.
- **General Maintenance Tips:** For routine care, wash the sink with soap and water after each use, then dry with a soft cloth. While ceramic resists moisture, keeping it dry is beneficial. Pay special attention to cleaning the junction between the sink edge and the countertop to avoid buildup of mineral deposits and grime. Avoid abrasive cleaners and sponges, as these can scratch the surface and diminish its beauty and longevity.

TROUBLESHOOTING GUIDE

Clogged Drain:

- Start by using hot or boiling water, or a mixture of vinegar and baking soda, to break up minor blockages. If these methods fail, a commercial drain cleaner may be necessary for stronger cleaning.
- If the clog persists, use tools like a plunger, drain auger (snake), Zip-It tool, or wet-dry vacuum.
- Hair often causes clogs; remove the drain cover, clean out any hair, rinse it, and replace the cover.
- As a last resort, clean the P-trap. Place towels and a bucket under the sink, locate and unscrew the P-trap, clean it with water, dish soap, or vinegar, then reassemble and test for proper drainage.

Sink Leakage:

- Inspect the seal between the sink and countertop for gaps or wear. A damaged seal can lead to leaks.
- Remove old caulk and apply a new layer of waterproof bathroom caulk or silicone sealant around the base of the sink where it meets the countertop.
- Check that the drain assembly is tightened properly; a loose drain can allow water to seep onto the countertop.
- Examine the faucet and its connections for leaks. Ensure the faucet is securely attached and that all connections are tight.
- After making adjustments, dry the area thoroughly and monitor it while using the sink to see if the issue persists.

Wobbling or Loose Sink:

- If the seal is old and damaged, it can cause the sink to wobble. Remove the old seal with a putty knife, disconnect the drain, and lift out the sink. Clean the countertop of any remaining seal and apply a fresh layer of silicone sealant between the sink and countertop for improved stability.
- Check the drain assembly for looseness. Tighten the drain nut under the sink to secure it firmly.
- Ensure the countertop surface is flat and even. Uneven surfaces can cause the sink to wobble. If needed, add shims between the sink and countertop to level it.

- Ensure your sink and its surroundings are well-sealed with caulk to protect against water intrusion.

WARNING

- AVOID using abrasive cleaners, scouring pads, or steel wool on the sink. These materials can scratch and damage the finish.
- Handle your sink with care, particularly during installation. Bathroom sinks can suffer chips or cracks from rough handling. Ensure it is properly and securely installed to avoid any risks.
- DO NOT overload the sink with heavy items. Bathroom sinks are not designed to bear excessive weight, and overloading them could result in damage or a safety hazard.
- DO NOT place hot items directly on the surface of the sink to avoid the risk of cracking or discoloration.
- DO NOT alter the structure of the sink. Any modifications can compromise its integrity and safety.
- Prevent clogs by ensuring the drain remains free of debris. Blocked drains can cause water backup and potential damage.
