Emergency Overview

White paste product w/ a slight acrylic & ammoniacal odor. Removal of this product after use may result in the generation of dust. If dry-sanded, exposure to dust may result in material getting into eyes, ears, nose & mouth which may result in irritation. Harmful by inhalation & if swallowed. Effects of Overexposure: Eye Contact: Direct eye contact may cause irritation. Skin Contact: May cause skin irritation & may result in dry skin. Inhalation: Inhalation may cause irritation to nose, mouth & mucous membranes. Inhalation of dust may cause lung damage & other adverse pulmonary & respiratory effects.
