
Van Zyverden's LILAC PURPLE





The botanical name of the common Lilac is Syringavulgaris, but its common name does it little justice. It is an upright, multi-stemmed, deciduous shrub in the olive family that typical matures to 12-16 feet tall and 8-12 feet wide. It is a very reliable spring-flowering shrub for cold winter gardens. Excellent choice as a specimen/accent in small groups, shrub borders, hedges or screens. Great in cottage gardens or in the margins of woodland gardens. Who doesn't love plain, simple, perfect Lilacs?

Attracts hummingbirds and butterflies to the garden

Tolerant of deer and clay soils About This Variety: Its flowers are very fragrant - lilac to purple flowers with white margins. It is a good cut flower that is beloved for bouquets.

Growing Instructions: Dig a hole about a foot deep and a foot wide. Set the plant in the hole and fill it half full with soil. Water. After water is drained, fill the rest of the hole with the remaining soil. Then water thoroughly again and continue doing so regularly.

Care Tip: Not recommended for the deep south in USDA zones 8-9.

Exposure: Full sun

Height: Grows 8-15' tall

Spacing: Plant- 6-12' apart, crown 2-3" deep

Hardy in: USDA zones 3-7
