Whenever possible cover the product and /or place under patio or awnings.






Stains may be removed with mild soap solution and damp cloth.

CAUTION: This Dining chair is NOT a TOY.


Keep your child / children at bay during the assembly process.





Assembly Steps


Overview



This Dining Chair has multiple parts and may require up to 30 minutes to assemble. To give you an overview of the **Dining chair parts**, the above picture is provided to help you put the various parts into perspective. Please read through the instructions below to familiarise yourself with the parts and steps before assembly.




Unpack and place all parts on a clean, non-marring surface.



Place the Seat Panel (D) lie as shown in the picture above onto a clean, soft surface to avoid any scratches or damage to the product. With assistance from your adult partner(s):

2.1 Attach the Seat Panel (D) & Support Bar (E) to the Right leg Panel (A), using Screws (1) and the Allen Wrench (3) as shown above.

2.2 Attach Backrest Panel (C) to the Right leg Panel (A), using Bolts ((2)) and the Allen Wrench ((3)) as shown above. **DO NOT fully tighten the Bolts and Screws at this time.**




Place the step 2 lie as shown in the picture. With assistance from your adult partner(s):

3.1 Attach the Left Leg Panel (B) to Seat Panel (D) & Support Bar (E) of the Step2, using Screws (1) and the Allen Wrench (3) as shown above.

<u>3.2</u> Attach Left Leg Panel (B) to the Backrest Panel(C) of the Step 2, using Bolts (2) and the Allen Wrench (3) as shown above. **DO NOT fully tighten the Bolts and Screws at this time.**

Step 4



Turn the Chair right side up.

Inspect the Chair and make sure all parts are adequately connected.

In a sequential manner, tighten all Screws and Bolts at all joints.


Place the Chair on a flat, level surface to make sure it is balance

CAUTION: When tightening these screws and bolts, tighten sequentially.

DO NOT tighten any screw or bolt fully and then move towards the next one. This could cause the frame to warp.

WARNING!! IF THE Chair IS NOT STABLE, IT COULD LEAD TO DAMAGING THE PRODUCT.

Step 5



Place Chair Seat Cushion (F), onto the Chair.

Then affix the "magic tape straps" around the Chair as shown above.

Your **Dining chair** is ready to be used.

This **Dining chair** can only be used on a flat, level surface.

Questions & Answers about Proposition 65

What is Proposition 65?

Proposition 65 requires businesses to provide warnings to Californians about significant exposures to chemicals that cause cancer, birth defects or other reproductive harm. These chemicals can be in the products that Californians purchase, in their homes or workplaces, or that are released into the environment. By requiring that this information be provided, Proposition 65 enables Californians to make informed decisions about their exposures to these chemicals.

Proposition 65 also prohibits California businesses from knowingly discharging significant amounts of listed chemicals into sources of drinking water.

Proposition 65 requires California to publish a list of chemicals known to cause cancer, birth defects or other reproductive harm. This list, which must be updated at least once a year, has grown to include approximately 900 chemicals since it was first published in 1987.

• What types of chemicals are on the Proposition 65 list?

The list contains a wide range of naturally occurring and synthetic chemicals that include additives or ingredients in pesticides, common household products, food, drugs, dyes, or solvents. Listed chemicals may also be used in manufacturing and construction, or they may be byproducts of chemical processes, such as motor vehicle exhaust.

What does a warning mean?

If a warning is placed on a product label or posted or distributed at a workplace, a business, or in rental housing, the business issuing the warning is aware or believes that it is exposing individuals to one or more listed chemicals. By law, a warning must be given for listed chemicals unless the exposure is low enough to pose no significant risk of cancer or is significantly below levels observed to cause birth defects or other reproductive harm.
