Van Zyverden's AGAPANTHUS WHITE



Agapanthus is an evergreen perennial that can be planted in the garden in the warmer parts of the US (zones 7-11). Best grown in containers and protected from winter conditions in more northern locations. Commonly called Lily of the Nile and is actually from South Africa. Produces large flower clusters on tall stalks arising from a mound of strap-shaped leaves.

About This Variety: While the blue agapanthus cultivars are more popular, the white makes for a cooling color and focal accent plant in the garden.

Growing Instructions: As a tender perennial, they are best planted in containers in more northern locations (USDA zone 8 and higher). Be sure to provide consistent moisture. Plants like being pot-bound. Relocate pots before first frost to a protected space to overwinter them safely. Water sparingly during winter.

Care Tip: Use in the garden in warmer climates and in containers in more northern areas where they are not winter hardy.

Blooms: June to August

Exposure: Full sun

Height: Grows 36-48" tall

Spacing: Plant 12-18" apart, 1.5-2" deep

USDA Zones: Hardy in USDA zones 7-11
