## WHAT'S THE BIG DEAL?

### THE STINK



Basing your washing schedule on the stink of your towels is like timing your dentist visits by the pain in your cavities -- it's a reactive approach to your health that is detrimental and harmful.

### WASTE & COST

To control bacteria, experts say you need to be washing (and drying and folding) towels at least every 2 days if they are allowed to dry - otherwise every day! Plus you should be using oxygenated bleach and very hot water to kill the bacteria. If you're someone who values conservation and being green, this is bad news.

It's also bad news if you are trying to prolong the life and color of your towels.

Consumers who have bacteria and cost in mind will have only a few choices when it comes to towel warmers. Higher wattage, square bars, correct sizing and method of control all influence the performance of reducing bacteria and keeping costs down.

### **GARMENT HOOK**

Plating of any kind including chrome and nickel plating exposes risks of peeling and rusting. High quality SAE 304 Stainless Steel is the best material for moist environments. An IP56 rating also protects against water intrusion.

### **12 BARS**

Fewer bars means not enough heat distribution and too many bars is wasted heat and expense. Brandon Basics found 12 bars to be the perfect balance of efficient heat distribution and cost for American sized towels.

### 190-200 Watts

To reduce bacteria growth, towels need to dry fast - within 1 to 2 hours. That means a wattage greater than 150watts. Towel warmers with lower wattage not only gives more time for bacteria to grow, but requires larger warmers to avoid folding the towel which prolongs drying time.

Our warmer is over 190 Watts which can dry two folded towels layered on top of each other.

### **TECHNOLOGY LAGS CONSUMER NEEDS**

Towel warmers haven't changed in decades, yet, American towels have only gotten thicker, more luxurious and absorbent - not to mention LARGER. We designed and manufactured our Brandon Basics warmer in 2017 to address the technology gap that exists. You now have a warmer that not only perfectly fits your towels, but also dries them before bacteria growth gets out of hand.

### **DESIGNED IN THE USA** FOR USA TOWEL SIZES

Folded lengthwise, a typical American Bath Sheet fits perfectly on the warmer for optimum drying efficiency. That means warmers with bars wider than 18" and a heating length over 30" is overkill

### **BUILT-IN TIMER**

At 190watts, moist towels will dry within 1 to 2 hours depending on how wet the towels are. So we provide 1 and 2 hour timers to keep it simple and cost effective.




### INSTALL OPTIONS

In looking for a towel warmer you'll find two options: Plugin or Hardwired. We understand that your needs may change so we include both options at the same cost (e.g. Install as a plugin now and later hardwire after your bathroom renovations)

### **SQUARE BARS**

Rounds bars are cheaper to manufacture, but they don't distribute direct heat to towels as effectively as square bars



### **STRAIGHT BARS**

Curved bar towel warmers are stylish, but purely for aesthetic purposes. The curved bar prevents towels from having full contact with the heated bars requiring more time to dry
