Growing Instructions: To ensure optimal results: allow adequate space and sunlight, plant at the appropriate depth, feed with a well balanced fertilizer, remove spent flowers after leaves turn yellow. Best planted in late fall. In some areas, gardeners treat flower bulbs as annuals. For an informal look, plant in groups in natural swathes or bouquets.

Care Tip: In USDA zones 8-10, refrigerate the bulbs for no less than eight weeks. In the garden, plant them before frost but not as early as in the northern part of the country. Planting them in a lightly shaded area will keep them cool and prolong blooming.

Exposure: Full sun to partial shade

Height: Grows 5-12" tall

Spacing: Plant 4-8" apart, 3-6" deep

USDA Zones: Hardy in USDA zones 3-8
