GENERAL SAFETY RULES

Safety is a combination of common sense, staying alert, and knowing how your chipper shredder works. **SAVE THESE SAFETY INSTRUCTIONS**.



WARNING: To avoid mistakes that could cause serious injury, do not plug in the chipper shredder until the following steps have been read and understood.

- 1. READ and become familiar with this entire instruction manual. LEARN the tool's applications, limitations, and possible hazards.
- 2. AVOID DANGEROUS CONDITIONS. Do not use power tools in wet or damp areas or expose them to rain. Keep work areas well-lit.
- 3. DO NOT use power tools in the presence of flammable liquids or gases.
- 4. ALWAYS keep your work area clean, uncluttered, and well-lit. DO NOT work on floor surfaces that are slippery with sawdust or wax.
- 5. KEEP BYSTANDERS AT A SAFE DISTANCE from the work area, especially when the tool is operating. NEVER allow children or pets near the tool.
- 6. DO NOT FORCE THE TOOL to do a job for which it was not designed.
- 7. DRESS FOR SAFETY. Do not wear loose clothing, gloves, neckties, or jewelry (rings, watches, etc.) when operating the tool. Inappropriate clothing and items can get caught in moving parts and draw you in. ALWAYS wear non-slip footwear and tie back long hair.
- 8. WEAR A FACE MASK OR DUST MASK as operation produces dust.



WARNING: Dust generated from certain materials can be hazardous to your health. Always operate the chipper shredder in a well-ventilated area and provide for proper dust removal.

- 9. ALWAYS remove the power cord plug from the electric outlet when making adjustments, changing parts, cleaning or working on the tool.
- 10. KEEP GUARDS IN PLACE AND IN WORKING ORDER.
- 11. AVOID ACCIDENTAL START-UPS. Make sure the power switch is in the OFF position before plugging in the power cord.
- 12. REMOVE ADJUSTMENT TOOLS. Always make sure all adjustment tools are removed from the chipper shredder before turning it on.

GENERAL SAFETY RULES (CONTINUED)

- 13. NEVER LEAVE A RUNNING TOOL UNATTENDED. Turn the power switch to OFF. Do not leave the tool until it has come to a complete stop.
- 14. NEVER STAND ON A TOOL. Serious injury could result if the tool tips or is accidentally hit. DO NOT store anything above or near the tool.
- 15. DO NOT OVERREACH. Keep proper footing and balance at all times. Wear oil-resistant rubber-soled footwear. Keep the floor clear of oil, scrap, and other debris.
- 16. MAINTAIN TOOLS PROPERLY. ALWAYS keep tools clean and in good working order. Follow instructions for lubricating and changing accessories.
- 17. CHECK FOR DAMAGED PARTS. Check for alignment of moving parts, jamming, breakage, improper mounting, or any other conditions that may affect the tool's operation. Any part that is damaged should be properly repaired or replaced before use.
- 18. MAKE THE WORKSHOP CHILDPROOF. Use padlocks and master switches and ALWAYS remove starter keys.
- 19. DO NOT operate the tool if you are under the influence of drugs, alcohol, or medication that could affect your ability to use the tool properly.
- 20. USE SAFETY GOGGLES AT ALL TIMES—that comply with ANSI Z87.1. Normal safety glasses only have impact resistant lenses and are not designed for safety. Wear a face or dust mask when working in a dusty environment. Use ear protection, such as plugs or muffs, during extended periods of operation.



SPECIFIC SAFETY RULES FOR CHIPPER SHREDDER



WARNING: Do not operate your chipper shredder until it is completely assembled and installed according to the instructions.

- 1. Before starting the chipper shredder, make sure that the hopper inlet is empty.
- 2. Keep your face and body away from the opening.
- 3. Do not allow hands or any other part of the body or clothing near the hopper or discharge chute.
- 4. Never put your hands into the hopper while the chipper shredder is running. Always use the paddle supplied with your shredder to push items into the hopper.
- 5. Do not try to force objects larger than the recommended diameter of 1-5/8" into the hopper.
- 6. Keep proper balance and footing at all times. Do not overreach. Never stand at a higher level than the base of the tool when feeding material into chipper shredder.
- 7. Always stand clear of the discharge zone when operating the chipper shredder. Never reach under the shredder until it has come to a complete stop.
- 8. When feeding material into the chipper shredder be careful to remove pieces of metal, rocks, bottles, cans or other foreign objects that may damage the blades.
- 9. If the cutting mechanism strikes a foreign object or if the chipper shredder should start making any unusual noise or vibration, turn it off and allow it to come to a complete stop. Disconnect from power supply and take the following steps:
 - Inspect for damage;
 - Check for and tighten any loose parts.



WARNING: Never reach into the hopper until the chipper shredder has come to a complete stop and is unplugged. The blades will continue to rotate for a few seconds after the shredder is turned off.

10. Do not allow processed material to build up in the discharge zone; this may prevent proper discharge and can result in kickback of material through the hopper.



WARNING: Never put your hands near the discharge chute. Failure to heed the warning could result in serious injury.

- 11. If the shredder becomes clogged, turn it OFF and disconnect from power supply before clearing debris. Keep the power source clear of debris and other accumulations to prevent damage to the power source.
- 12. Keep all guards and deflectors in place and in good working condition.
- 13. Do not operate the chipper shredder on a paved or gravel surface where ejected material could cause injury.
- 14. Turn off the chipper shredder and disconnect it from the power supply whenever you leave the work area.
- 15. Do not tilt the chipper shredder while it is running.
- 16. Never reach into the hopper until the chipper shredder has come to a complete stop and has been disconnected from the power supply.

ELECTRICAL INFORMATION

DOUBLE INSULATION

Double insulation is a concept in safety in electric power tools that eliminates the need for the usual three-wire grounded power cord. All exposed metal parts are isolated from the internal metal motor components with protecting insulation. Double insulated tools do not need to be grounded.

WARNING: The double insulated system is intended to protect the user from shock resulting from a break in the tool's internal insulation. Observe all normal safety precautions to avoid electrical shock. NOTE: Servicing a product with double insulation requires extreme care and knowledge of the system. This should be performed only by a qualified service technician. For service, we suggest you return the product to your nearest authorized service center for repair. Always use original replacement parts intended for your particular model of tool when servicing.

WARNING: Do not expose to rain or use in damp locations.

ELECTRICAL INFORMATION (CONTINUED)

Guidelines for using extension cords

Make sure your extension cord is in good condition. When using an extension cord, be sure to use one heavy enough to carry the current your product will draw. An undersized cord will cause a drop in line voltage resulting in loss of power and overheating. The table below shows the correct size to be used according to cord length and nameplate ampere rating. If in doubt, use the next heavier gauge. The smaller the gauge number, the heavier the cord.

Make sure your extension cord is properly wired and in good condition. Always replace a damaged extension cord or have it repaired by a qualified person before using it.

Protect your extension cords from sharp objects, excessive heat and damp or wet areas.

Use a separate electrical circuit for your tools. This circuit must not be less than a #12 wire and should be protected with a 15 A time-delayed fuse. Before connecting the motor to the power line, make sure the switch is in the OFF position and the electric current is rated the same as the current stamped on the motor nameplate. Running at a lower voltage will damage the motor.



WARNING: This tool must be grounded while in use to protect the operator from electric shock.

ASSEMBLY AND ADJUSTMENTS

Unpacking (Fig. 2)

Unpack the chipper shredder and all its parts, and compare against the list below. Do not discard the carton or any packaging until the chipper shredder is completely assembled.

ASSEMBLY AND ADJUSTMENTS (CONTINUED)

Tools needed for assembly

- Adjustable wrench
- Screwdriver

Setup the stand and attach wheels

- 1. Insert the end frame (20) into each hole of the two legs (19 & 21).
- 2. Position the axle tube (12) between the two legs (19 & 21).
- 3. Slide the wheel axle (10) through the hole in one of the legs (19) then through the axle tube (12) and out through the hole in the other leg (21).



- 4. Position the washers (14) and wheel spacer (11) on each end of the axle.
- 5. Push the wheels (9) onto each end of the wheel axle (10).
- 6. Position the washers (13) and the locknuts on each end of the wheel axle and tighten both the wheel nuts using a wrench.



NOTE. The wheels must be fitted the correct way round to allow the nuts to tighten on each end of the axle.

- 7. Press the wheel covers into the wheels to cover the ends of the axles. You may use a hammer to seat them securely over the axles.
- 8. Lock the end frame (20) to 2 legs (19 & 20) using fixed screws (16).

Attach the stand to shredder main body

Turn the main body upside down, insert the two ends of the stand assembly into the housing.

OPERATION

Starting

Make sure the switch is in the OFF position. Plug the chipper shredder into a suitable outlet using an approved extension cord if necessary. Push the ON/OFF switch to "ON" to turn the chipper shredder on.

Stopping

Push the ON/OFF switch to "OFF" to turn the chipper shredder off.



CAUTION: The chipper shredder will not operate if the hopper locking knob is loose.

Overload protection



Your chipper shredder is designed with overload protection. If the shredder is clogged during shredding, the overload protection will cut the power automatically to protect your shredder. Wait at least 1 minute before restarting by first pressing the reset button and then the ON/OFF switch.

Hopper

Hopper locking knob

The chipper shredder is fitted with a safety interlock switch on the closure between the hopper and main body. The switch is activated when the hopper is securely closed and tightened by the hopper locking knob. When the hopper is opened or not fitted well, the shredder will not run. Always tighten the hopper locking knob by turning it clockwise before operation.

Blades

The blades on the rotary plate are reversible. For quality and safety reasons, we recommend that only identical replacement blades be used should it become necessary to replace them.

Shredding Material



WARNING! Before starting, ensure that the feed inlet is empty.

CAUTION! Longer material standing out from the shredder could lash out when being pulled in by the blades. Keep a safe distance.



CAUTION! When using the chipper shredder and feeding branches into the shredder, sometimes the blades pull the material into the opening. Keep hands at a safe distance.

WARNING! Always wear ear and eye protection and wear gloves during operation.



CAUTION! The ventilation slots must not be covered.

- 1. Only insert as much material as to prevent blockage of the feeding funnel. Chop chipper waste that has been stored for a few days and is wilted and damp alternately with dry branches. This prevents the cutting blades from blocking up. Widely branched material with leaves must be completely chopped before new material is fed. Make sure that the chopped material can fall freely from the ejection slot.
- 2. Keep hold of branches while feeding them into the chipper shredder until they are automatically drawn in.
- 3. Keep to the working speed of the chipper shredder and do not overload it.
- 4. To protect the chipper shredder from clogging, shred wilted chipper waste that has been left for a few days and shred thin twigs alternately with branches.
- 5. Before you shred roots, remove any remaining soil and stones from them.
- 6. Do not shred soft, damp material such as kitchen waste, take it straight to the compost.
- 7. Keep a few dry branches for the end, as they will help clean the chipper shredder.
- 8. Only switch the chipper shredder off after all of the shredding material has passed through the discharge chutes. Otherwise, the discharge chutes may jam the next time the shredder is turned on.

WARNING

Prior to inspection or maintenance, turn off power switch and disconnect plug from power source.



WARNING! Always wear gloves when cleaning.

Cleaning chipper shredder

- 1. Unscrew the hopper locking knob counter clockwise and open the hopper.
- 2. Clean cutting blades and discharge area and remove wood sticks or objects that may clog the blades.
- 3. The chipper shredder has two blades that are attached to a rotary plate with two screws. Before any maintenance or cleaning is done on the blades, always turn the switch off and disconnect the plug from the power source.
- 4. Check blades for damage. Use only identical replacement parts if it becomes necessary to replace them.
- 5. Return the hopper to its upright position and tighten the knob before operating the chipper shredder.
- 6. Use only a warm damp cloth and a soft brush to clean your chipper shredder. Always wear safety glasses to protect your eyes during cleaning.

Caution: Never spray water on the chipper shredder or wash it with water. Do not use detergents or solvents as these could cause irreparable damage to your shredder.

- 7. The fastening screws of the stand assembly should be checked from time to time. Periodically check all nuts, bolts and screws to be sure the shredder is in safe working condition.
- 8. Make sure the ventilation slots are always kept clean and are free of debris.
- 9. To protect the chipper shredder from corrosion when storing for a long period, treat the cutting blade with oil.

Cutting blade replacement

- 1. The reversible blade is fixed to the rotary plate with two screws. Before any maintenance or cleaning of the blades, always turn the switch off and disconnect the plug from the outlet.
- 2. Turn the Hopper Locking Knob counterclockwise until the housing cover can be opened.
- 3. Lift up the housing cover to expose the two blades.
- 4. Align the slots on the board, the blade support and the main body and insert a metal rod like a screwdriver into the slots to prevent rotating when removing the blade with the supplied hex key.
- 5. Remove the old blade. Either reverse the blade so the sharp edge is in the cutting position or insert a replacement blade. Use the same method to replace the other blade.
- 6. Replace and tighten the two screws to secure the new blade to the support.
