About This Variety: Sedum are heat and drought tolerant, they will grow in nearly any soil. Brilliant produces dinner-plate sized flowers which are a huge favorite to pollinators like butterflies. While it flowers mid-summer to fall, leaving the foliage and flowers when dried will deliver substantial winter interest.

Growing Instructions: Plant in spring in well-drained soil in full sun. Remember to divide your plants in the years to come to control their spread.

Care Tip: The plants require little maintenance as long as they are planted properly and establish themselves. After flowering, cut back the plants to maintain their shape.

Exposure: full sun Height: grows 12-24" tall Spacing: plant 18-24" apart, 0.5" deep USDA Zones: hardy in USDA zones 3-9
