Breeding and hybrid crosses have produced many new varieties in recent years. Combine with hostas and ferns for shade garden color all summer.

Care Tip: Do not allow soil to dry out during summer.

Blooms: April to May

Exposure: Partial Shade To Full Shade

Height: Grows 18-24" tall

Spacing: Plant 18-24" apart, 1.5-2" deep

USDA Zones: Hardy in USDA zones 3-8
