Van Zyverden's CROCUS ORANGE MONARCH



There are many different types of the world famous Crocus genus available. Some are fall, winter or spring blooming. These are the well-known spring bloomers that are long-lived. A variation that everyone knows and loves. They are easy to grow and often the first color of spring. The flowers are tubular cup shaded, atop grass-like basal foliage. They perennialize nicely, providing a splash of color.

About This Variety: Wow! You won't find these in a typical box store. Orange Monarch is a giant blooming, orange black striped Crocus, appropriately named as the colors resemble that of a monarch butterfly. Each bulb produces three stems. Perfect as a garden accent for they are easy to grow and extremely hardy and strong. These even bloom during a snowstorm.

Growing Instructions: To ensure optimal results allow adequate space, sunlight, plant at the appropriate depth, feed with a well balanced fertilizer, allowing the leaves to yellow/brown before removing.


Care Tip: Crocus can be successfully grown in a lawn for a spring meadow effect. Hold off on mowing the lawn in spring until the Crocus foliage begins to die back.

Exposure: Full sun to partial shade

Height: Grows 4-6" tall

Spacing: Plant 2-3" apart, 2-4" deep

USDA Zones: Hardy in USDA zones 3-9
