

Care & Maintenance Guide

Resistant to heat, scratches, and etching, this natural stone is an ideal choice for high-traffic areas and is easy to care for by following a few simple steps.



Routine Cleaning

- Clean day-to-day using a soft cloth with mild, non-acidic detergent and warm water.
- Dry with a clean, non-abrasive towel to deter water spots.



Prevent Damage

- Maintain a dust and debris-free surface and be cautious with heavy objects.
- Practice care by using cutting boards and hot pads to protect against scratches or thermal shock.
- Clean spills immediately, especially acidic substances like lemon juice, wine, or vinegar.
- Annual sealing can additionally improve stain resistance and help preserve this natural stone's beauty, but it is not a must.



Avoid Harsh Chemicals

- Do not use bleach, oven cleaners, Comet, or any products containing trichlorethane or methylene chloride.
- Keep harsh chemicals such as paint removers, paint, and furniture strippers away from the surface.



Handling Stains

- For dried spills, scrape gently with a plastic spatula before cleaning.
- For tough stains, create a poultice paste with baking soda and water. Apply it to the stain, cover with plastic wrap, and let it sit for 24-48 hours. Remove and clean the area.
- For stubborn stains like ink, wine, or nail polish, use a non-abrasive cleaner and a damp cloth.
- For adhesive stains, apply a small amount of rubbing alcohol or an adhesive remover designed for natural stone surfaces. Rinse thoroughly with water after application.
