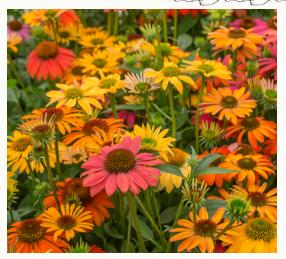
Van Zyverden's ECHINACEA CHEYENNE SPIRIT

Echinacea is a favorite of the herbal medicine industry and is always one of the most profound wild flowers on the plains. Plant en masse to create curb appeal and help support threatened wildlife. Native to the southeastern United States.

About This Variety: Cheyenne Sprit is a well-branched, sturdy variety that won several awards for garden performance. Flowers in its first year in a wide range of colors.

Growing Instructions: Best planted in full sun and will return for years to come. Divide clumps when they become overcrowded (about every 4 years). Plants usually rebloom without deadheading, however, prompt removal of spent flowers improves general appearance. Freely self-seeds if at least some of the seed heads are left in place.

Care Tip: Best in groups or massed, but is also an excellent specimen and/or accent plant.

Blooms: June to August Exposure: Full sun to partial shade Height: Grows 12-30" tall Spacing: Plant 12-24" apart, 1.5-2" deep USDA Zones: Hardy in USDA zones 4-9
