
Van Zyverden's DUTCH IRIS LION KING





Dutch Iris hybrids grow from bulbs that can be planted in fall or spring and are often grown as annuals. These graceful and elegant flowers bloom atop grass-like foliage. They are easy to grow, and if zone appropriate, are great for naturalizing. They are often used as cut flowers.

About This Variety: The Lion King's Iris colors are as unique as the lion's mane swaying in the light. Purplish brown standards with yellow falls that are brown striped, with dark bluish green, grass-like foliage. A must have for the early summer garden.

Growing Instructions: Choose a site that has reasonably fertile soil and plenty of moisture that won't dry out in summer. Good drainage and a sheltered location will help them survive the winter.

Care Tip: Plant about 15 bulbs per square foot. Zone 5 gardeners should add a 2" layer of mulch in fall. Best planted in large numbers.

Exposure: Full sun to partial shade

Height: Grows 20-24" tall

Spacing: Plant 4" apart, 5" deep

USDA Zones: Hardy in USDA zones 6-8
