4. FIRST AID MEASURES

Emergency and First Aid Procedures:	Skin: Immediately begin washing the skin thoroughly with large amounts of water and mild soap, if available, while removing contaminated clothing. 6. ACCIDENTAL RELEASE MEASURES

Small spills: Take up with sand, earth or other noncombustible absorbent material and place in a plastic container where applicable.

Large spills: Dike far ahead of spill for later disposal.
