

RECOMMENDED ITEMS

- Clean cloth, duster or vacuum with soft nozzle attachment
- •Clean, soft cloth or sponge for washing
- Separate Clean towel or cloth for drying
- Mild detergent, such as dish soap
- Clean water
- Light pressure spray bottle, bucket or garden hose
- Distilled white vinegar for tough stains



INSTRUCTIONS

Gently dust the door with either a soft rag, duster or vacuum that has a soft nozzle attachment.

Wash the door with plain water and a soft cloth or sponge, using a garden hose or light pressure spray.

In areas where dirt collection is heavier or mildew has occurred, a very mild detergent may be used. Make sure to dilute your soap mixture by adding more water as to not strip off the color during the cleaning process.

For tougher stains, you can try a solution of one part vinegar to one part water, but always test on a small, inconspicuous area first.

To minimize streaking, always wash from the top to the bottom.

A clean water rinse should follow immediately.

Dry the door completely with a soft, clean towel to prevent water spots.

If your front door has glass accents, you can clean with a mixture of water and vinegar and either squeegee dry or wipe dry with a cloth.

Strong solvents and abrasive type cleaners should be avoided to prevent any permanent damage to the door's finish.
