It is free-blooming and features daisy-like flowers with yellow and brownish centers. Prolific bloomer from mid-summer into fall. Goldstrum is one of the most popular perennials commercially grown.

Care Tip: Deadhead spent flowers to encourage additional bloom.

*Exposure:* full sun *Height:* grows 18-24" tall *Spacing:* plant 24" apart, 1.5-2" deep *USDA Zones:* hardy in USDA zones 4-9
