## Van Zyverden's GRAPE HYACINTH GIANT COBALT BLUE





Muscari, also commonly known as Grape Hyacinths, are spring flowering bulbs that should be planted in the fall. Each produces a cluster of narrow strap-shaped, basal leaves, usually appearing just before the flowers. Leafless flower stems bear dense spikes of small flowers. These dainty, grape-like clusters of color make a dramatic underplanting for taller bulbs of nearly any color. Planted en masse or in broad, informal sweeps, they create an unforgettable show! Muscari colonize and naturalize readily, are self-seeding under ideal conditions and thrive for many years to come with little care or maintenance. When in bloom, feel free to cut some flowers for tiny vase bouquets.

About This Variety: Cobalt Blue Muscari can be used just about anywhere or any way. Easy to grow. The flowers are long lasting and compliment just about any other plant in your garden. Look good in flowerbeds, pots, along pathways and even in containers.

Growing Instructions: To ensure optimal results, allow adequate space and sunlight, plant at the appropriate depth and feed with a well balanced fertilizer. Allow the leaves to yellow/brown before removing. For an informal look, plant in groups in natural swathes.

Care Tip: Plant in well draining soil. After planting, water well to settle the bulbs.

Exposure: Full Sun to Partial Shade

Height: Grows 10-14" tall

Spacing: Plant 3" apart, 3-4" deep

USDA Zones: hardy in USDA zones 4-10
