

## *VanZyverden's* CROCUS SPRING BEAUTY



There are many different types of the world famous Crocus genus available. Some are fall, winter or spring blooming. These are the well-known spring bloomers that are long-lived. A variation that everyone knows and loves. They are easy to grow and often the first color of spring. The flowers are tubular cup shaded, atop grass-like basal foliage. They perennialize nicely, providing a splash of color.

*Unique variety and color*

*Best planted in groups or drifts*

*Deer and critter resistant variety*

*About This Variety:* Spring Beauty is an uniquely colored, pale lilac flamed and dark purple species Crocus. Species Crocus are among the earliest of all Crocus's to flower, and therefore, sometimes the preferred choice to plant in lawns. Shorter than other species Crocus and good in garden borders. Flowers open and close on sunny days. Foliage is uncommonly narrow with median silvery stripes.

*Growing Instructions:* To ensure optimal results allow adequate space, sunlight, plant at the appropriate depth, feed with a well balanced fertilizer, allowing the leaves to yellow/brown before removing. Plant about nine bulbs per square foot for a solid planting.

*Care Tip:* Crocus can be successfully grown in a lawn for a spring meadow effect. Hold off on mowing the lawn in spring until the Crocus foliage begins to die back.

*Exposure:* Full sun to partial shade

*Height:* Grows 3" tall

*Spacing:* Plant 2-3" apart, 2-4" deep

*USDA Zones:* Hardy in USDA zones 3-9
