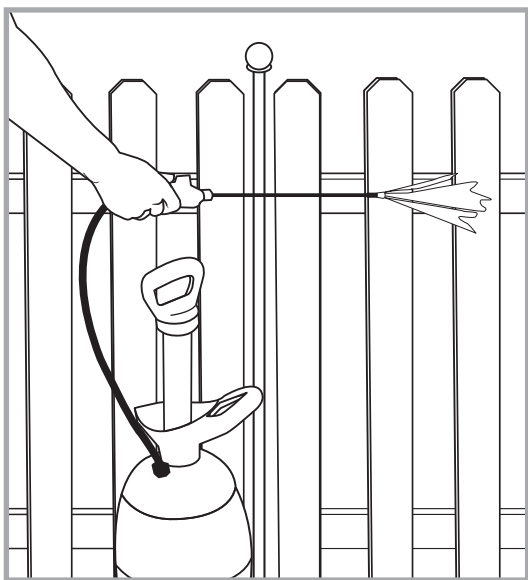


How to Care for Your Cedar Fence



Best Practices

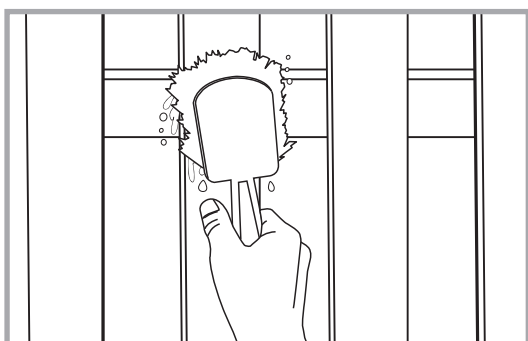
- Clean at least once a year
- Avoid direct contact with the ground
- Avoid excess contact with water
- Direct irrigation and watering systems away from fence when in use

Cleaning

We suggest you clean your fence at least once a year.

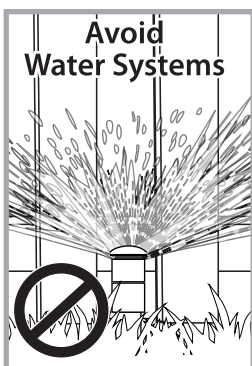
Combine 3 quarts of warm water + 1 quart of oxygen bleach + ¼ cup of non-ammonia dish soap.

Spray liberally onto fence and allow to sit for 10 minutes. Scrub and rinse.



Treating Mold and Mildew

Mold and mildew stains should be removed as soon as they appear. Use the same cleaning methods above to remove any stains. Leaving untreated can result in damage to the cedar.



Cedar Protection

While cedar is extremely durable and will remain attractive for years, it is best to apply a sealant shortly after installing to avoid discoloration and splintering over time.

To Apply

Select a waterproof sealant appropriate for cedar wood.

Apply 1 thin coats of the sealer with a paintbrush or sprayer. Allow the sealer to completely dry, then apply a second coat.

Repeat application every 3 - 5 years
