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IMPORTANT SAFETY INSTRUCTIONS

READ AND SAVE THESE INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. WARNING:** To Reduce The Risk Of Fire, Electric Shock, Or Personal Injury, Mount Directly To A Structural Framing Member Or To An Outlet Box Marked Acceptable for Fan Support of 15.9 kg (35 lbs) . For Outlet Box Mounting, Use Mounting Screws Provided With The Outlet Box.
- To avoid possible electrical shock, before installing or servicing your fan, disconnect the power by turning off the circuit breakers to the outlet box and associated wall switch location. If you cannot lock the circuit breakers in the off position, securely fasten a prominent warning device, such as a tag, to the service panel.
- To reduce the risk of electric shock, this fan must be installed with an isolating wall control/switch.
- 4. WARNING:**To reduce the risk of personal injury, do not bend the blade brackets when installing the blade brackets, balancing the blades, or cleaning the fan. Do not insert foreign objects in between rotating fan blades.
- Chemical burn hazard. Keep batteries away from children. This remote contains a lithium button cell battery. If a new or used lithium button/coin cell battery is swallowed or enters the body, it can cause severe internal burns and can lead to death in as little as 2 hours. Always completely secure the battery compartment. If the battery compartment does not close securely, stop using the product, remove the batteries, and keep it away from children. If you think batteries might have been swallowed or placed inside any part of the body, seek immediate medical attention. Dispose of cells properly and keep away from children. Even used cells may cause injury.
- Non-rechargeable batteries are not to be recharged. Exhausted batteries are to be removed from the product.
- This appliance can be used by children aged from 8 years and above and persons with reduced physical, sensory or mental capabilities or lack of experience and knowledge if they have been given supervision or instruction concerning use of the appliance in a safe way and understand the hazards involved. Children shall not play with the appliance. Cleaning and user maintenance shall not be made by children without supervision. It is recommended that children be supervised to ensure that they are not using the appliance improperly.
- 8. WARNING:**To reduce the risk of fire or electric shock or injury to persons, do not use replacement parts that have not been recommended by the manufacturer (e.g. parts made at home using a 3D printer).
- Read all instructions and safety information before installing your new fan. Review the accompanying assembly diagrams.
- Before installing the fan, disconnect the power by removing fuses or turning off circuit breakers.
- Make sure all electrical connections comply with local law and the national electrical code. Please hire a qualified electrician or consult a do-it-yourself wiring handbook if you are unfamiliar with installing electrical wiring.
- Make sure the installation site is roomy enough to allow fan blades to rotate. There is at least seven feet from the floor to fan blades' tips.
- If you are mounting the fan on a ceiling outlet box, please use a metal outlet box. Secure the box directly to the building structure. The outlet box and its support must be able to support the rotating fan (at least 35 lbs). Do not use a plastic outlet box. Attach the mounting bracket using the ceiling outlet box's hardware.
- After installing the fan, make sure all the connections are secured so that the fan won't fall.
- Do not insert anything between fan blades while the fan is operating.
- Turn the fan off and wait for it to stop before reversing fan's rotating direction.
- 17. WARNING:**To reduce the risk of electrical shock and personal injury, do not install the fan on a sloped ceiling and do not use this fan with any solid-state fan speed control device, or rheostat. You must install the outlet box using the two steel screws and lock washers coming with the fan.
- All wiring must be in accordance with national and local electrical codes ANSI/NFPA 70. If you are unfamiliar with wiring, use a qualified electrician.
- After making the wire connections, the wires should be spread apart with the grounded conductor and the equipment-grounding conductor on one side of the outlet box and the ungrounded conductor on the other side of the outlet box.
- The splices after being made should be turned upward and pushed carefully up into the outlet box.
- Instructions for supply connections: the white conductor of a fan identified as grounded conductor to be connected to a grounded conductor of power supply, the black conductor of fan identified as ungrounded conductor to be connected to an ungrounded conductor of power supply, the green conductor of fan identified for equipment grounding to be connected to an equipment-grounding conductor.
- The total weight of the fan install to outlet box is 7.2 kg, check that the outlet box is securely installed in place such that it is able to support at least the fan weight.
- When mounted directly to the building structure, appliance installation shall not expose combustible material and do not install the appliance to a ceiling with combustible finish. The installation of the appliance cannot leave the wood of the rafters or any thermal insulation exposed to the interior of the room.
- To Reduce The Risk Of Electric Shock, Disconnect The Electrical Supply Circuit To The Fan Before Installing Light Kit.







WARNING

To avoid serious injury or death, turn off the power at the circuit breaker before installing the fan.




IMPORTANT

Input Voltage: 120 VAC, 60 Hz

- Connect the ground wire to the supply ground, ensuring its length exceeds that of the safety cable.
- A means for disconnection must be incorporated in the fixed wiring in accordance with the wiring rules.
- Do not connect the fan to a damaged power source.



ASSEMBLING THE CEILING BRACKET

Concrete Ceiling




Concrete Ceiling:

Use expansion screws when:

Drill holes with an electric drill ($\phi 8$ mm).

Use expansion screws to fix the mounting bracket to the ceiling.

Wooden Ceiling




Wooden Ceiling:

Use wood screws when:

Securing to support structure with approved electrical outlet box.

Fasten the mounting bracket to the ceiling with Wood Screw.


Ceiling Bracket → Blades → Downrod → Hanging the Ceiling Fan



Gentle reminder:

Turn over the top foam box and place the ceiling fan body upward on its foam cavity when assembling the blades to prevent any damage to the wires.



Aligning the holes on blades, the blade holding plate (place it on the blades) and the screw holes on motor as shown in illustration, and then install the set screws.

Note: Please tighten the screws manually with a phillips screwdriver. Using a power drill may damage the wooden blades.

Install the trim cover onto motor shaft by turning clockwise until tight.

NOTE: Follow the instructions on the blade carefully. Incorrect installation could result in the fan not functioning properly.


! WARNING: FAN FALL HAZARD

To prevent SERIOUS INJURY or DEATH:

- ALWAYS tighten setscrew with screwdrivers.
- DO NOT hand tighten setscrew.
- CHECK the setscrew is tight using screwdrivers each time you change fan direction.


The downrod ball has been pre-installed on the 5-inch downrod. If you wish to move it to the 10-inch downrod, please follow these steps.


Loosen and remove the two screws on the downrod ball from the 5-inch downrod.


Lift the downrod upwards, then remove the horizontal bar, and detach the downrod ball from the 5-inch


Tighten the two screws on the downrod ball from the 10-inch downrod position.

Insert the first perforated screw tightly, and then insert the second screw tightly.



Remove the pre-installed set screws and downrod pin.

Ceiling Bracket → Blades → **Downrod** → Hanging the Ceiling Fan



Insert the canopy, canopy cover and then the yoke cover to the downrod.


Pass all the wires to one side of the horizontal bar in the downrod to prevent excessive wire tangling.

Carefully slide the downrod into the yoke of the motor assembly. Align the holes in the downrod. Carefully re-install the downrod pin and clip.



Yoke Cover




Put down the yoke cover.

HANGING YOUR CEILING FAN



Place the downrod ball into the ceiling bracket.

Make sure the downrod ball slot matches the inner lock.


Rotate the downrod until it's secured.




Plug the motor wire terminal and supply wire terminal into the corresponding wire terminals of the receiver and properly connect the wires.

Note: Twist the bare metal ends of the wires together and fit a wire nut over them. Swivel the wire nut clockwise until tight. Give it a gentle pull to ensure none of the wires come off.


Note: Please do not connect to an AC Wall Switch.




Insert the remote receiver into mounting bracket.




Rotate the canopy clockwise. Align the screws on the bracket with the holes in the canopy and snap them into place.



Tighten all the canopy screws with a screwdriver.




Put the canopy cover up and rotate clockwise until it engages.



- ① LED indicated light
- ② Turn off the fan
- ③ Timing control of the fan
- ④ Optional: Anti-theft function(Press hold for 3 seconds to turn on this function)

1. Learning code matching mode is used between emitter and receiver. Turn "ON" the supply power within 30 seconds and press the emitter's " ⏻ " button for 5 seconds, it can load normally after hearing a long sound "bee", which means learning successfully and it can works normally. (PS: Learning mode is not accepted after turn "ON" the supply power for 30 seconds)
2. When the emitter cannot control the receiver, please check the battery switch touching normally or not, correction of the positive and negative, full or empty of the power.
3. When the emitter cannot control the receiver, please check is there any existence of similar remote controlled products nearby, then check whether they works, because remote controlled product with the same frequency will disturb each other.
4. Low voltage of battery will affect the sensitivity of the emitter and the signal reception accordingly (the indicated light will flash out its warning when the battery get low voltage), must replace if the battery is getting low voltage.
5. Please take out the battery from the emitter when leaving unused for long time.
6. The maximum load of lighting see the above "POWER PARAMETER LIST"
PS: please connect the ground wire correctly, otherwise it may cause the light micro-light or flash
7. **When installing the fan, the fan ceiling cover don't press the antenna (or other wire), it is easy to breakdown the wire and short-circuited.**


Installing one fan operating on multiple remote controls



To have multiple fans operated by a single remote control, you must pair the remote control to each additional receiver. The receiver that shipped with your fan is already paired to the remote control.

- Power cycle the fan by toggling the wall switch (or circuit breaker if needed). Within 5 seconds long press the **ALL OFF** () on your remote for 5 seconds to pair it.
- If applicable, the fan will turn on, along with a continuous beep to indicate successful pairing.

Installing multiple fans operating on a single remote control (Up to Two Fans)



To have multiple fans operated by a single remote control, you must pair the remote control to each additional receiver. The receiver that shipped with your fan is already paired to the remote control.

- For each additional fan, ensure that a compatible receiver is installed. Disconnect power from all other fans while pairing.
- Power cycle the fan by toggling the wall switch (or circuit breaker if needed). Within 5 seconds long press the **ALL OFF** () on your remote for 5 seconds to pair it.
- If applicable, the fan will turn on, along with a continuous beep to indicate successful pairing.



NOISE

When it is quiet (especially at night) you may hear occasional small noises. This is normal. Please allow a 24-hour “breaking-in” period, most noises associated with a new fan disappear during the time.

Your fan may occasionally jerk forward or backward upon starting up. This is normal and does not affect the fan operation. Try these troubleshooting steps before contacting customer service.

Problem	Solution
<p>Fan not spinning</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Make sure the fan is getting power. • Check your circuit breaker or fuse panel and wall switch for functionality. • Check to make sure the fan wires are correctly connected to the house wires. • Remote control must be paired with the fan within 1 minute after connecting the fan to the electricity. • Use a multi-meter and test the adapter wiring harness to see if there is any electrical output. • All the pin wiring on the circuit board must be inserted tight and in the correct position. • Remote needs to be paired with the fan first. • Make sure the fan blades spin freely. • If you're using a wall control, check the power to the breaker from your control and try working your ceiling fan manually. (Normal switch only for the fan power on/off)
<p>Fan not working</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Make sure wires are connected to the circuit board. • Make sure the whole fan is powered.
<p>The fan is noisy and wobbling</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Check if the blade screws are NOT rubbing against any part of the motor housing. • Check the pin wires are NOT connected against any moving parts. • Check the down fan cup is NOT hitting the motor. • Confirm the canopy is NOT touching the ceiling while the fan is in operation. • Check the down rod is NOT slanted. • Tighten any loose screws on the kit, fan blades, motor coupling, down rod, brackets and mounting hardware. • Confirm the hanger ball is firmly seated in the mounting bracket. • The ceiling beam must meet the minimum tensile test strength of 30KG for installation. • Make sure the blades and brackets are NOT bent or deformed. • Verify the wire connections are not rattling against each other. • Verify the fan blades are not cracked. If the fan blades are cracked, replace the damaged blades with a new blade set from the same brand as your ceiling fan to ensure compatibility. • Confirm the kit is NOT slanting and hitting the motor.
<p>The fan or automatically turns on/off</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Confirm the circuit breaker is not malfunctioning. • Verify the wire connections are not frayed. • Check the app is not set to a timer or schedule. • Cut the fan power for 10 minutes then power on again. • All the pin wiring on the circuit board must be inserted tight and in the correct position.
