Care & Maintenance




- ⊘  ● Not for commercial use. For residential use only.
- ⊘  ● Prolonged exposure to rain may cause rusting which can stain floors.
- ⊘  ● Do not put hot items directly on furniture surface.
- ⊘  ● Do not clean furniture with harsh cleansers or polish.
- ✓  ● To obtain the longest lifespan of your outdoor products, minimizing exposure to direct sunlight is recommended.
- ⊘  ● Children should not climb or jump on the furniture.
- ⊘  ● Do not write on furniture without a padded barrier to protect the surface.
- ✓  ● To obtain the longest lifespan of your outdoor products, avoid extended and lengthy exposure to rain, snow, and direct sunshine. Whenever possible cover the product and /or place under patio or awnings.
- ⊘  ● Stains may be removed with mild soap solution and damp cloth.
- ✓  ● Keep away from sources of ignition.
- ✓  ● Dust and pick-up spills using a clean, non-colored, lint-free cloth.







- Do not assemble on flooring or carpet-



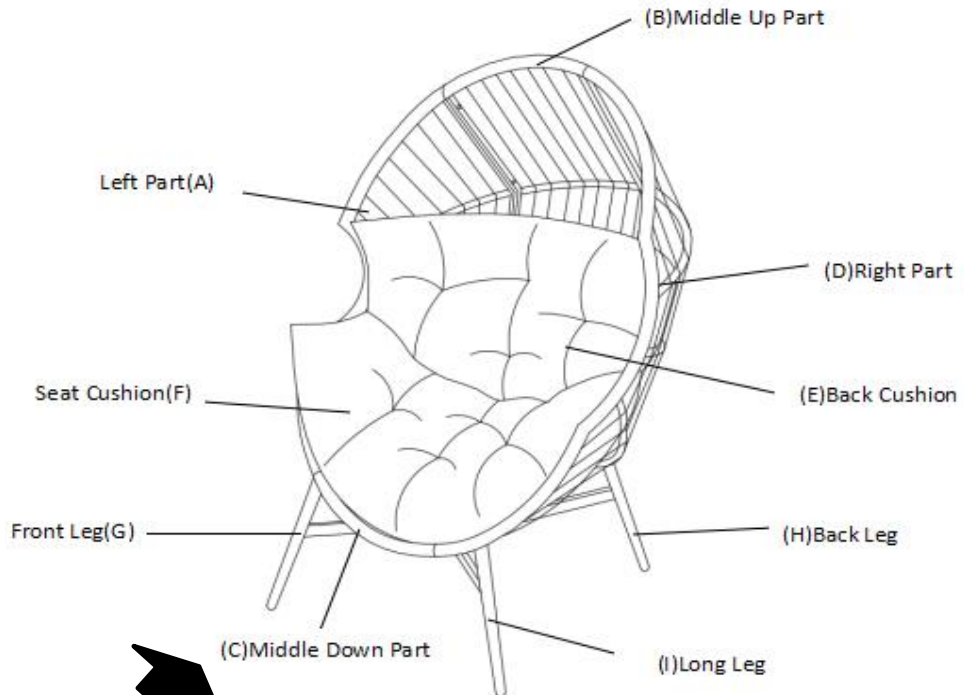
- Assemble on a clean non-marring surface (packing foam)-

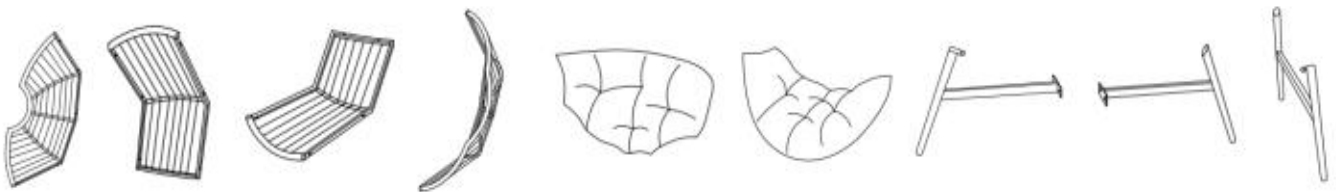
Overview



FRONT FACING

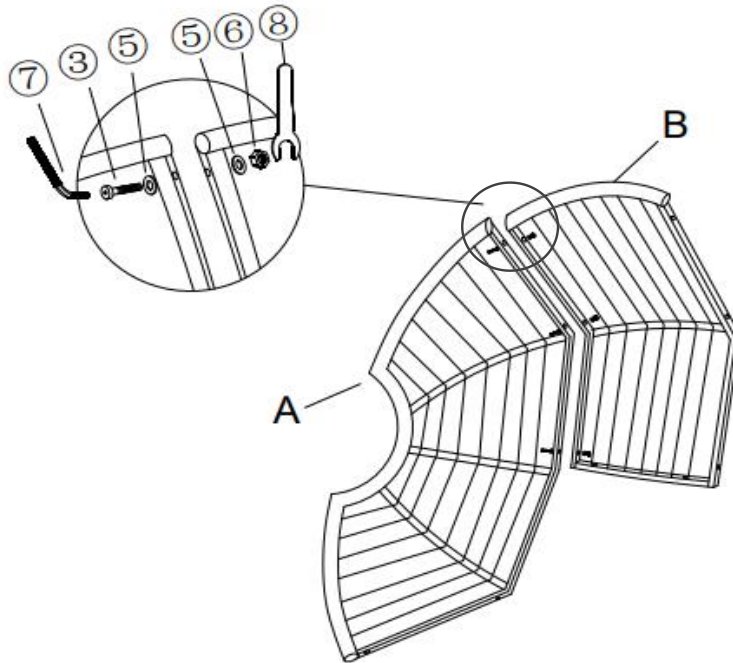
This chair has multiple parts and may require up to 30 minutes to assemble. To give you an overview of the various parts, the above picture is to help you put the various parts into perspective. Please read through the instructions below to familiarise yourself with the parts and steps before assembly.

Step 1



Unpack and place all parts on a clean, soft surface.

Step 2

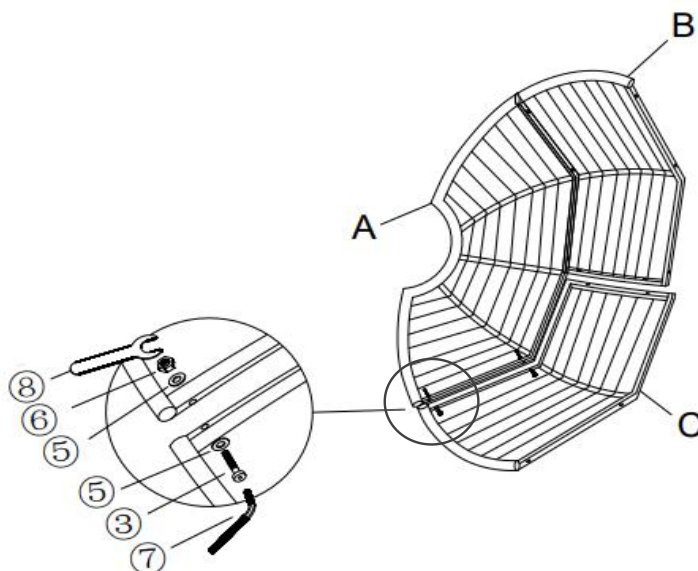


Place the Left Part (A) and Middle Up Part (B) on a clean, non-marring surface.

Attach Left Part (A) to Middle Up Part (B) using Washer(5) & Bolts(3) on one side and Washer(5) & Nut(6) on the other side with Allen Wrench(7) and Spanner(8).

Do not fully tighten the Bolts.

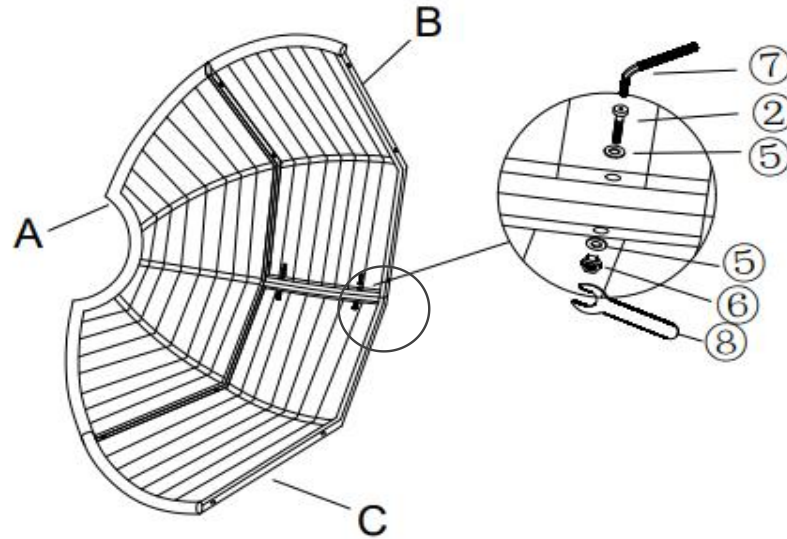
Step 3



Attach Middle Down Part (C) to Left Part (A) using Washer(5) & Bolts(3) on one side and Washer(5) & Nut(6) on the other side with Allen Wrench(7) and Spanner(8).

Do not fully tighten the Bolts.

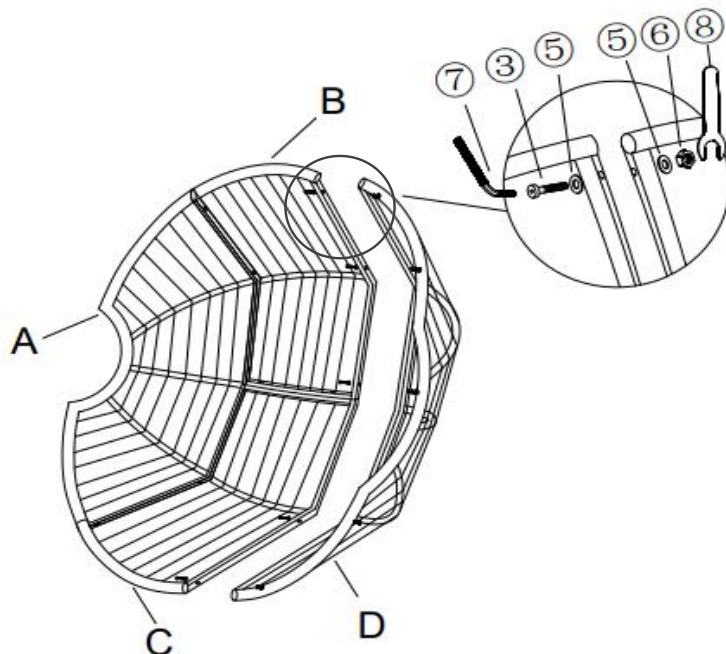
Step 4



Attach the Middle Up Part (B) to Middle Down Part(C) using Washer(⑤) & Bolts(②) on one side and Washer(⑤) & Nut(⑥) on the other side with Allen Wrench(⑦) and Spanner(⑧).

Do not fully tighten the Bolts.

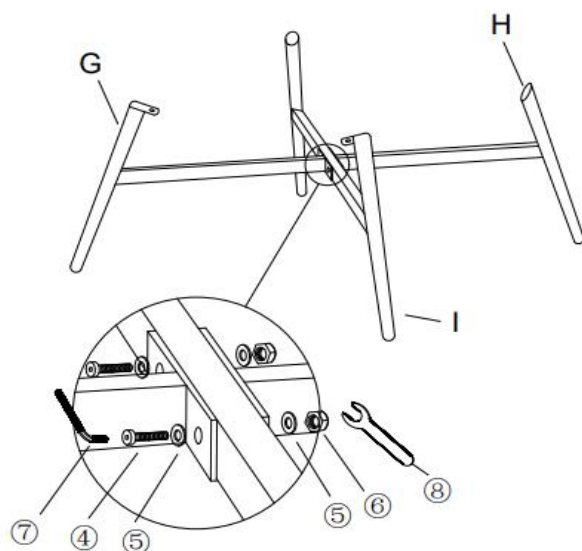
Step 5



Attach Right Part (D) to Middle Up Part (B) and Middle Down Part (C) using Washer(⑤) & Bolts(③) on one side and Washer(⑤) & Nut(⑥) on the other side with Allen Wrench(⑦) and Spanner(⑧).

Do not fully tighten the Bolts.

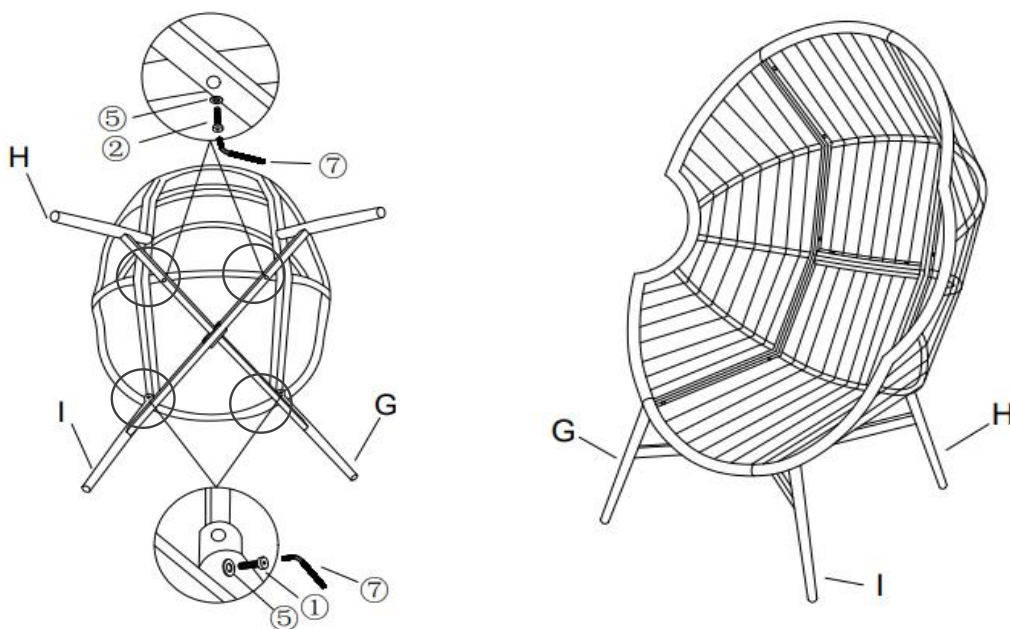
Step 6



Attach Front Leg (G) and Back Leg (H) to Long Leg (I) using Washer(⑤) & Bolts(④) on one side and Washer(⑤) & Nut(⑥) on the other side with Allen Wrench(⑦) and Spanner(⑧).

Do not fully tighten the Bolts.

Step 7



Attach Back Leg (H) and Long Leg (I) to the Chair using Washer(⑤) and Bolts(②) with Allen Wrench(⑦).

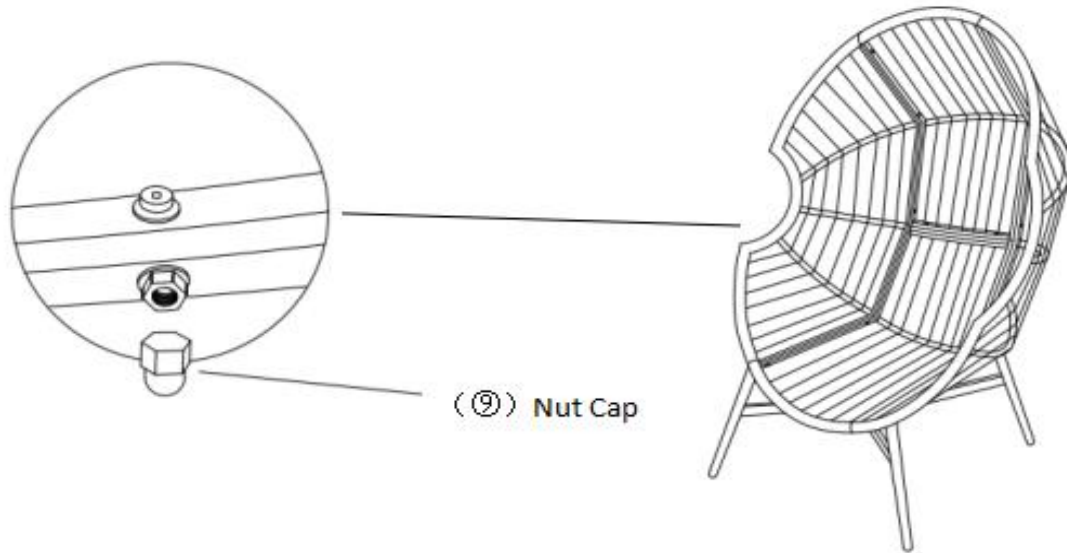
Attach Front Leg (G) and Long Leg (I) to the Chair using Washer(⑤) and Bolts(①) with Allen Wrench(⑦).

Place the chair on LEVELER SURFACE.

Inspect it and make sure all parts are adequately connected, and not wobble.

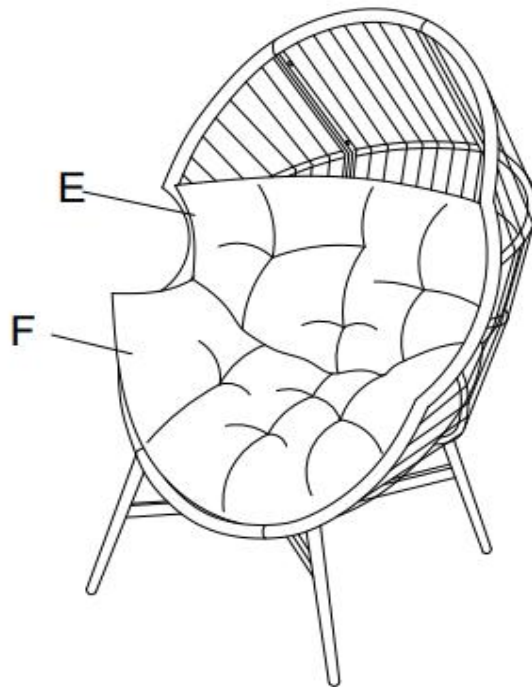
Tighten Bolts fully in a sequential manner.

Step 8



Cover all the Nut Cap(9) after all the bolts are tightened.

Step 9



Put Back Cushion(E) and Seat Cushion(F) and fix the cushion to the chair with cushion tie.

Your Chair is ready for use.

The Chair can only be used on a flat and level surface.

Questions & Answers about Proposition 65

• What is Proposition 65?

Proposition 65 requires businesses to provide warnings to Californians about significant exposures to chemicals that cause cancer, birth defects or other reproductive harm. These chemicals can be in the products that Californians purchase, in their homes or workplaces, or that are released into the environment. By requiring that this information be provided, Proposition 65 enables Californians to make informed decisions about their exposures to these chemicals.

Proposition 65 also prohibits California businesses from knowingly discharging significant amounts of listed chemicals into sources of drinking water.

Proposition 65 requires California to publish a list of chemicals known to cause cancer, birth defects or other reproductive harm. This list, which must be updated at least once a year, has grown to include approximately 900 chemicals since it was first published in 1987.

• What types of chemicals are on the Proposition 65 list?

The list contains a wide range of naturally occurring and synthetic chemicals that include additives or ingredients in pesticides, common household products, food, drugs, dyes, or solvents. Listed chemicals may also be used in manufacturing and construction, or they may be byproducts of chemical processes, such as motor vehicle exhaust.

• What does a warning mean?

If a warning is placed on a product label or posted or distributed at a workplace, a business, or in rental housing, the business issuing the warning is aware or believes that it is exposing individuals to one or more listed chemicals.

By law, a warning must be given for listed chemicals unless the exposure is low enough to pose no significant risk of cancer or is significantly below levels observed to cause birth defects or other reproductive harm.
