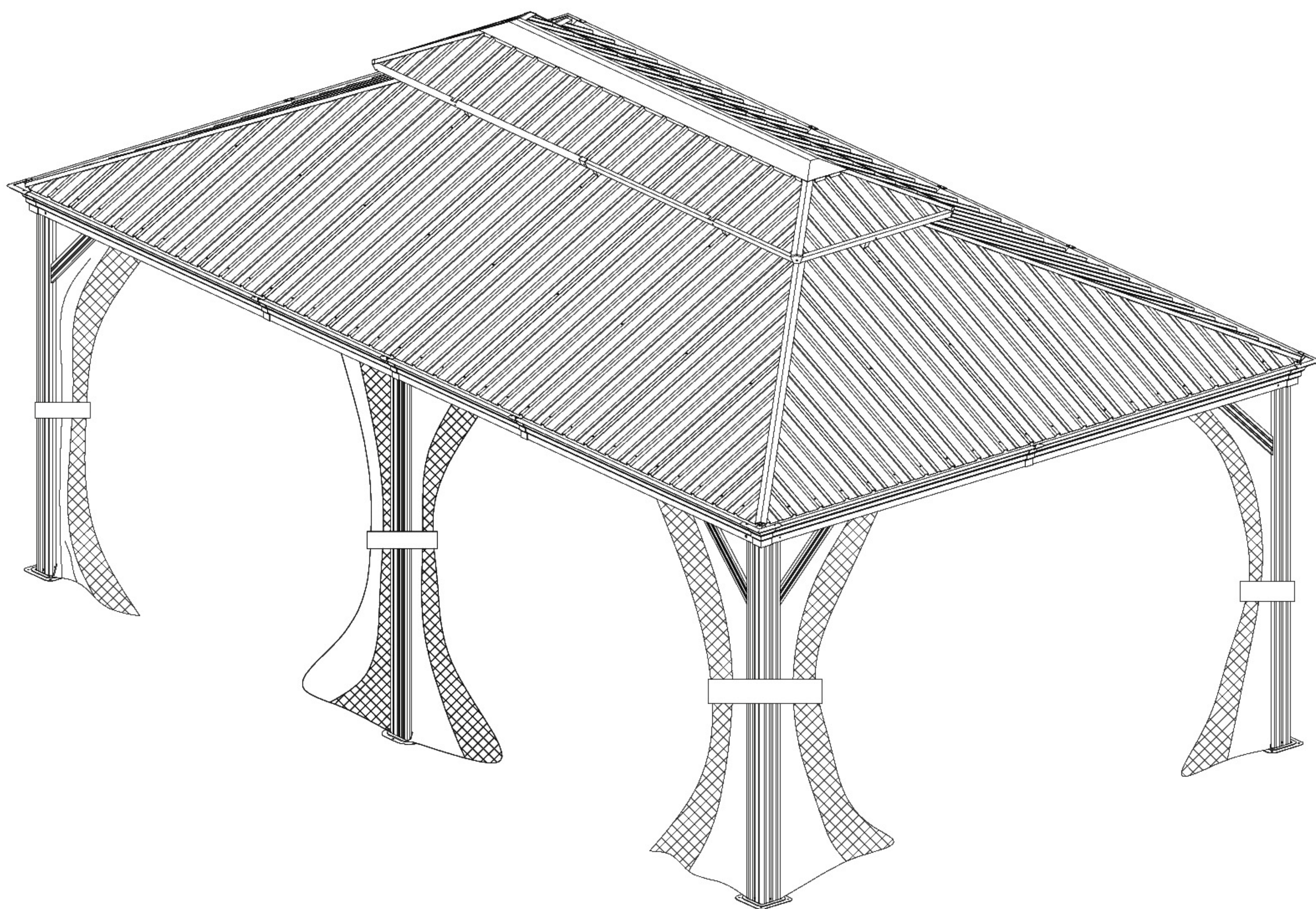
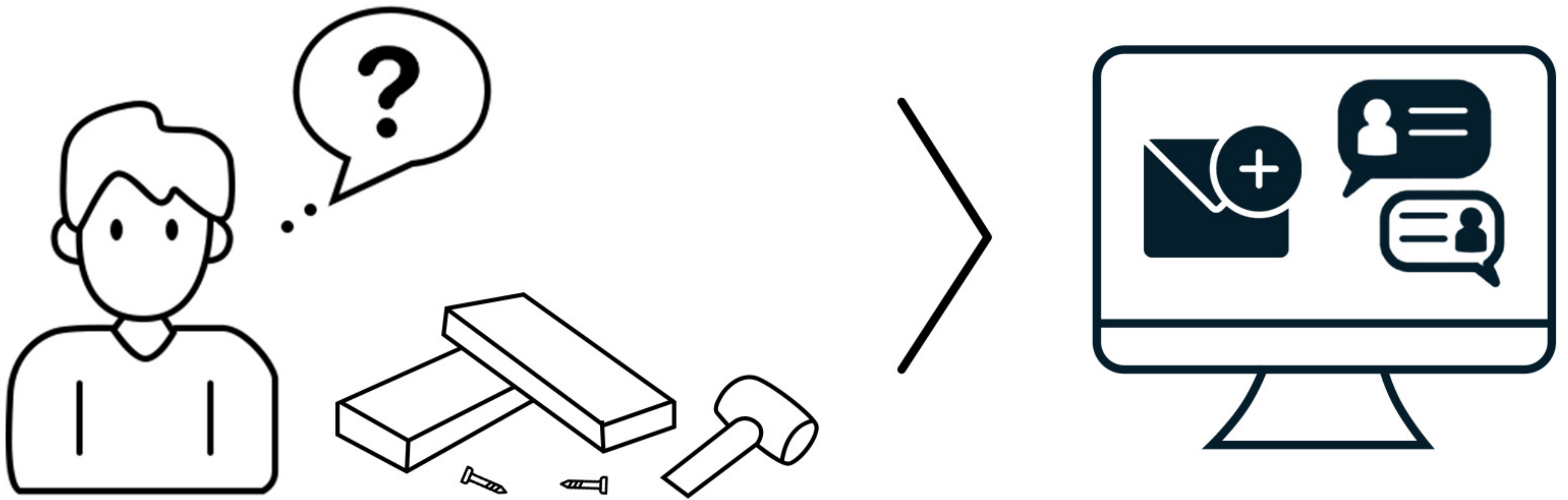

INSTALLATION GUIDELINES

Before You Begin

Prepare the Site:

- Select a level surface free from obstructions like rocks, roots, or uneven ground.
- Ensure the installation area is large enough for the gazebo's footprint and has enough clearance for assembly tools.
- For patios or decks, ensure the surface is sturdy and can bear the gazebo's weight.

Check the Package:

- Unpack all parts and cross-check them with the instruction manual.
- Lay out all components for easy access and confirm no pieces are missing or damaged.

Gather Tools:

- Recommended tools: ladder, rubber mallet, wrench set, screwdriver, and power drill (optional for quicker assembly).
- Safety gear: gloves, protective eyewear, and a stable ladder.

Teamwork:

- The gazebo is heavy and requires at least three or more people for safe assembly.

Check Weather Conditions:

- Avoid installing on windy or rainy days for safety.

Read Instructions Fully:

- Familiarize yourself with the manual before starting assembly.

Keep Small Parts Organized:

- Use a container to hold screws, bolts, and other small components to prevent loss.

Test Stability:

- Once fully assembled, inspect the structure for wobbling or loose connections.


Post-Installation Checklist:

MAINTENANCE AND CARE

Regular Cleaning

Roof:

- Use a soft brush or a cloth to remove debris such as leaves and dirt.
- For stubborn stains, mix mild detergent with warm water and clean with a non-abrasive sponge.
- Rinse thoroughly with clean water to prevent residue buildup.

Frame:

- Wipe down the aluminum frame with a soft, damp cloth to remove dust and dirt.
- For tougher grime, use a non-abrasive cleaner designed for aluminum.
- Dry the frame with a soft cloth to prevent water spots. Aluminum resists rust, but keeping it dry helps maintain its finish.

Curtains and Mosquito Netting:

- Remove and wash curtains following the care label instructions.
- For mosquito netting, gently shake off dust and clean with a vacuum or soft brush. Handwash if necessary, using mild detergent and air dry.

Seasonal Maintenance

Aluminum Frame Protection:

- Although aluminum is rust-resistant, inspect the frame periodically for surface scratches or minor wear. Touch up any exposed areas with a protective aluminum-safe coating.
- Avoid using abrasive materials or harsh chemicals that could damage the finish.

Roof Maintenance:

- Check the roof periodically for dirt, moss, or debris that may build up. Clean as needed to maintain its appearance and functionality.

Inspection:

- Periodically check for wear and tear, such as cracked welds, bent sections, or loose components. Address issues promptly to prolong the gazebo's lifespan.

Storage Tips:

- If not in use for an extended period, disassemble the gazebo and store in a dry, sheltered location.
- Ensure all parts are clean and dry before storage to prevent mildew or rust.
