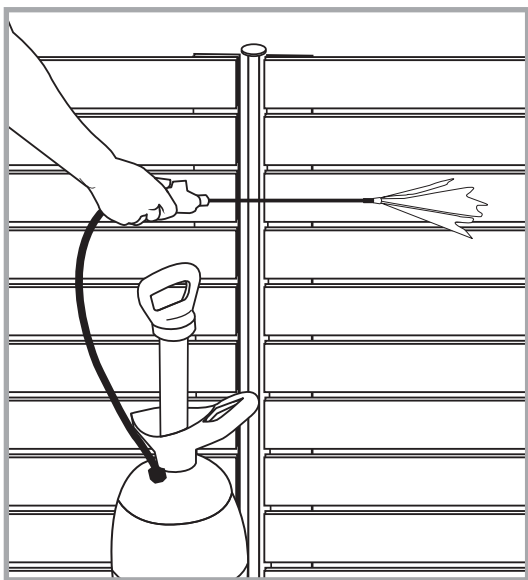


How to Care for Your Vista Cedar Fence



Best Practices

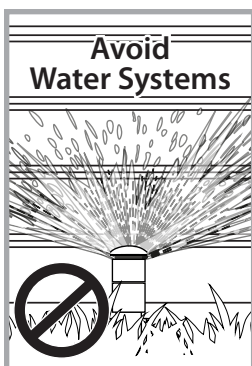
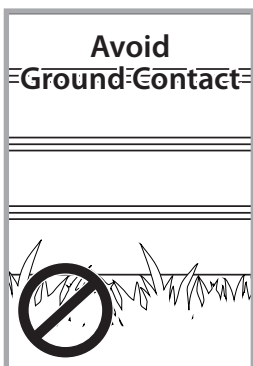
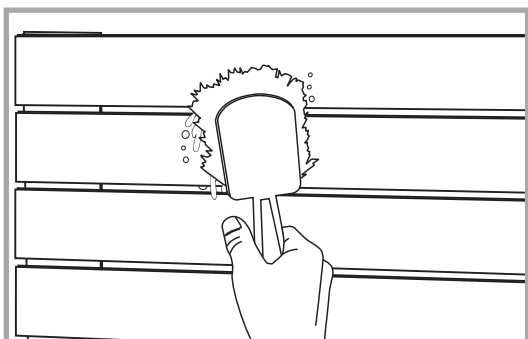
- Clean at least once a year
- Avoid direct contact with the ground
- Avoid excess contact with water
- Direct irrigation and watering systems away from fence when in use

Cleaning

We suggest you inspect and clean your fence at least once a year.

Combine 3 quarts of warm water + $\frac{1}{4}$ cup of non-ammonia dish soap.

Spray liberally onto fence and allow to sit for 10 minutes. Scrub with a bristle brush, then rinse with clean water. Do not wipe with towel or cloth that may shed.

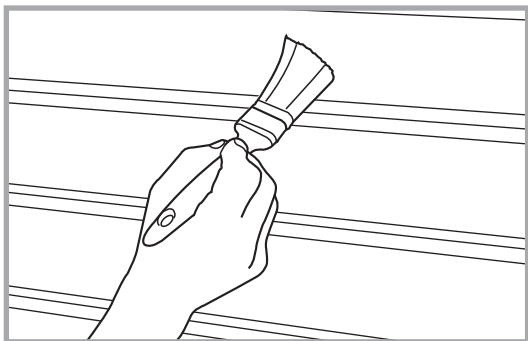


Treating Mold and Mildew

Mold or mildew stains should be removed as soon as they appear. Use the same cleaning methods above to remove any stains. Leaving mold or mildew on surface may result in damage to the cedar.

Cedar Protection

While cedar is extremely durable and will remain attractive for years, it is best to apply a stain to protect the cedar when or before color begins to fade.



To Apply

Select a exterior stain appropriate for cedar wood and that matches the dark color. Apply coat of the stain by paintbrush or sprayer.

Repeat application every 3 - 5 years
