

Steps for Cleaning Wood Doors

1. **Dust the Door:** Use a microfiber cloth or vacuum attachment to remove loose dust and cobwebs, especially on panels and decorative molding.
2. **Prepare the Cleaning Solution:** Mix a few drops of mild dish soap or a dedicated wood cleaner with warm water.
3. **Wipe Gently:** Dip a soft cloth in the solution, wring it out thoroughly (it should be damp, not wet), and wipe the door, following the direction of the wood grain.
4. **Target High-Touch Areas:** Focus on removing fingerprints and grime around the door handle and on the edges.
5. **Rinse:** If using soap, wipe again with a clean cloth slightly dampened with clear water to remove residue.
6. **Dry Immediately:** Use a clean, dry microfiber cloth to wipe down the entire door, preventing moisture from warping or damaging the wood.
7. **Polish/Protect:** Apply a wood polish or cleaner/preservative spray to restore luster.

Important Tips

- **Avoid Excess Water:** Never soak wood doors, as this can cause swelling or damage to the finish.
- **Spot Test:** Test any new cleaner on an inconspicuous spot first.
- **Handles & Hardware:** Clean metal hardware separately with a suitable cleaner, taking care not to get cleaner on the wood.
- **Avoid Harsh Cleaners:** Do not use ammonia or bleach, which can damage the wood finish.
- **Scuff Marks:** Use a melamine sponge gently on scuff marks if the door is painted and not stained.
