

Care of Your Table or Floor Lamp and Safety

GENERAL SAFETY RULES

WARNING: Read and understand all instructions. Failure to follow all instructions provided may result in serious injury.

CAUTION: Do not allow persons to operate or assemble this light until they have read this manual and have developed a thorough understanding of how the light works.

WARNING: The warnings, cautions, and instructions discussed in the manual cannot cover all possible conditions or situations that could occur. It must be understood by the operator that common sense and caution are factors that cannot be built into this product, but must be supplied by the operator.

Cleaning & Care:

To clean the shade, remove dust with either a paper towel or a duster—no household cleaners are needed.

If you have a Tiffany Style Lamp: Occasionally, a white powder may appear on the shade's soldering, as a result of oxidation. To restore the

soldering to its original condition, apply a small amount of Lemon or Mineral Oil to the affected area. Remove the oil with a paper towel, as described above. *Do not use chemical cleansers, as they may harm the finish of solder.*

Warning! If your lamp has been lighted for any period of time, the glass (shade, cap, bulbs etc.) will become hot and may burn if touched. Allow the glass to cool for a short period of time, testing it carefully prior to grasping it.

LIGHT LAMP USE AND CARE:

- Do not modify the light in any way. Unauthorized modification may impair the function and/or safety and could affect the life of the product. There are specific applications for which the warehouse barn light was designed.
- Check damaged or worn out parts before using you light lamp. Broken parts will affect the light lamps operation. Replace or repair damaged or worn parts immediately.
- When the shade is mounted in one certain way, store the other mounting bases or rods in case you decide to change how it is mounted in the future.
